Name: Kella Age: ???

Personality: Kella presents herself as a cheerful young woman, and for the most part lives up to that presentation. But she carries a great deal of rage and impatience, making her impulsive and temperamental. She can be very single-minded, often neglecting important tasks when they are not directly related to whatever she is focused on, but also giving her an unparalleled ability to problem solve.

Appearance: Kella inhabits the body of a young woman whose mind was destroyed when her body was taken into the Resanti Collective. She has moderate brown skin with several burn scars on her arms and legs, curly black hair that ends just beneath her chin, and reddish brown eyes. As a high security prisoner, she is given only sports bra and shorts to make it more difficult for her to conceal things within her clothes.

Background: Kella was created by the Resanti as an experiment in individuality, as the collective had seen how individuals could rapidly create alternative solutions that could not easily be predicted. The collective had hoped to create an individual that could operate as an extension of its will, while still having the freedom to make quick decisions and formulate unpredictable strategies. However, she proved too hard to control, and the Resanti locked her away aboard a small ship that was rigged to explode if she ever tried to escape. She was left to orbit Kelbar IX until the collective could think of a use for her. The Resanti couldn't anticipate that the *Eclipse* would show up and inadvertently mount a rescue operation, freeing Kella from her prison.

Although Kella was free of the Resanti Collective, the *Eclipse*'s crew didn't trust her, and she found herself once again trapped. At first she was locked within the Cleansing Rain, but since the *Eclipse* couldn't afford to have one of its interceptors out of commision, they sought a Resanti body for her to inhabit. Once trapped within her new body, Kella was condemned to the brig, where she desperately pleads with her new captors for freedom.
