About the Artist



Born in the Philippines, **Lino Rivera** has performed as a soloist, chamber musician, and accompanist across three continents. He is passionate about premiering contemporary works, exploring the challenges of piano transcriptions, and uncovering lesser-known piano repertoire.

A featured performer with Composers, Inc., a San Francisco organization promoting contemporary American composers, Lino has premiered three works in recent seasons, earning acclaim for his dynamic performances.

As Professor of Music at Saint Mary's College of California, he is committed to nurturing future musicians. He holds degrees in piano performance from the University of Santo Tomas, the University of Hawaii, and a Doctorate from the University of Maryland.

Dr. Rivera stays active with concert engagements nationwide and regularly participates in festivals worldwide, including the Music and More Summer Festival in Bosnia-Herzegovina (2023).

San Francisco Classical Voice praised his performance of Frederic Rzewski's North American Ballads, describing it as "remarkable music-making" that earned "a nonstop standing ovation."
