# GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. All awards will be made on the recommendation of the Haliburton Highlands Scholarship Fund Executive.
2. Candidates for awards must be full-time residents within the limits of the Haliburton County School Area, and shall have been full-time students of the Haliburton Highlands Secondary School for the year in which the award is given.
3. The Candidate must have received the necessary entrance requirements and must be proceeding to further education at a post-secondary institution, or in a specialized area of study, or be in attendance at the Haliburton Highlands Secondary School.
4. Apprenticeship is considered to be further education.
5. The Candidate must not be repeating the subject in the grade for which the award is given.
6. An Award is awarded to the student with the highest mark in the subject in the year concerned.
7. A Bursary is awarded to the student meeting special requirements and judged to be most deserving by the Scholarship Fund Executive. Consideration will be given by the Executive to such factors as financial need, award, general behaviour, and involvement in school activities by the Candidate.
8. In the case of a student who has chosen to defer attending post-secondary school and who wins an award which is conditional on the winner pursuing post-secondary education, the award or bursary shall be awarded to the student but the award money will be held in trust for the student in the Scholarship Fund for a period of one year. If after one year the money held in trust cannot be given to the student because he or she is not pursuing post-secondary education, or if the money is not claimed by the award winning student within one year from the date it was awarded, then the money shall be forfeited and will be used by the Scholarship Committee as it deems fit. A one-year extension of the deferral will be allowed if the student applies by June 30<sup>th</sup> in the year following the first deferral year. The student must still be planning to attend postsecondary school. No further extensions will be allowed.
9. If, in the opinion of the Executive, in any year there is no suitable Candidate for an award, the Executive may withhold the award for that year.
10. In the event that two or more Candidates tie for an award, the Executive may divide the Scholarship evenly, or may make the award on the basis of need.
11. Money that is not claimed by the award-winning student by December 31 of the year in which it was awarded will be forfeited and the money used by the Scholarship Committee as it deems fit for redistribution towards student awards in the future.
12. Awards designated in the Directory as **established** are administered by the Haliburton Highlands Scholarship Endowment Fund. The values of these awards may vary because of fluctuating interest rates.

# THE HISTORY OF THE H.H.S.S. SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Haliburton Highlands Secondary School Scholarship Fund presents over 200 awards to the undergraduates and graduates of H.H.S.S. every year.

Eighty-five of those awards come from the Haliburton Highlands Scholarship Endowment Fund. Many people and organizations have donated money over the years and the interest generated from these funds provides the money for these awards. The Endowment Fund continues to attract donations, often to provide an award in memory of a loved one.

The remaining awards are donated annually by businesses, service clubs and individuals throughout Haliburton County and beyond.

Almost 70 years ago, Harold Herlihey, a well-known and respected businessman in Wilberforce, donated money. This money was to be invested to provide an award in honour of his father. This award was to be presented to the graduating student with the highest overall average. The F. D. Herlihey Memorial Scholarship was the first award in our HHSS Scholarship program.

A few years later, Mr. Herlihey created another award in memory of his mother, the Mrs. Jean Herlihey Memorial Bursary.

Mr. Herlihey's brother, M. Robertson (Bob) Herlihey, was a teacher, and later a Vice-Principal of H.H.S.S. He assumed the responsibility for looking after the two investments which his brother had donated, and decided that it would be a good idea to have more. He talked to everyone and anyone who might be willing to donate money to establish an award. In many cases, individuals and organizations agreed to make annual awards. Some of the awards, which were established in the 1960s, were donated by the Rotary Clubs of Minden and Haliburton, and by the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch 129. Since the 1960's these organizations have added several more awards and bursaries.

In 1971 there were eight awards produced by investments and twenty to thirty awards from annual donations. Throughout the seventies the program continued to grow as Bob Herlihey encouraged the citizens of Haliburton County to support our high school students.

Bob retired from teaching in 1976, but he continued to serve as Chair of the Scholarship Fund for another nine years, and yet more awards were added to the catalog. The program we have today is Bob Herlihey's legacy to H.H.S.S.

The Scholarship Committee is very grateful for the overwhelming support we receive from Haliburton County and beyond. The H.H.S.S. Red Hawks are fortunate to receive this amazing financial assistance.

# HONOUR STUDENTS

The Staff of the Haliburton Highlands Secondary School believes that academic excellence should be appropriately recognized.

All students in Grades 9, 10, and 11 who have achieved Honours will be recognized at a special **Honours and Awards Assembly** in the Athletic Complex in October.

All graduates who have achieved Honours will be recognized during the **Commencement and Awards Ceremony** in the Athletic Complex in June.

The students' families and friends, and other interested people from the community are invited to attend the Graduation and Awards Ceremony.

## Honours Status Criteria

Conditions for earning Honours status are summarized below:

Grade	Requirements
9 & 10	minimum average of 80% on 8 courses at any level
11	minimum average of 80% on 7 courses at any level
12	minimum average of 80% on 6 senior level courses

- Marks from a variety of modes of delivery (regular high school classes, VLC, co-op, alternate education, summer school) will be used when calculating the average.
- Marks earned through a course upgrade cannot be applied toward the average.
- The courses must be completed in the year for which Honours status applies.
- For summer school credits, the marks are applied to the year that provides the greatest advantage for the student.

## Awards

- Students will receive an Honours Certificate for each year that the requirements for Honours status are achieved.
- **Graduating students** who have earned Honours status for 4 years will receive an Honours Plaque to commemorate the accomplishment.
