**Program Description:** The Early Childhood Care and Education program is a sequence of courses designed to prepare students for a variety of careers in the field of early childhood education. Learning opportunities develop academic, technical, and professional knowledge and skills required for job acquisition, retention, and advancement. The program emphasizes a combination of early childhood care and education theory and practical application necessary for successful employment.

\*\* Students are required to complete and pass all prerequisite coursework prior to enrollment in any subsequent or advanced courses. \*\*

**^Additional Requirements:** Students who finish the Early Childhood Education pathway at their high school with a B or higher in each class AND earn a 70 or higher on the NOCTI exam, can come into WGTC with earned credit for ECCE 1101 and 1103 (Students who do not meet the requirements for the single semester program should consider the full-year program.)

**Career Opportunities:** Program graduates may find employment as preschool teachers in public and private childcare facilities, private household childcare workers, self-employed childcare providers, or nursery school attendants.

**Estimated Program Fees:** \$ 40 per semester + the cost of any required fees, supplies, and uniform (approximately \$35)
