



Alcohol & Drug Awareness Program (ADAP)

Georgia law requires teenagers under the age of 18 to show proof that they have completed the Georgia Alcohol and Drug Awareness Program (ADAP) course to obtain a Class D Provisional Driver's License at age 16 or 17. Please note- you do not need the ADAP Certificate to get your Instructional Permit (AKA "Learners"). Students at CCHS participate in the online ADAP course (eADAP) while either in Health or JROTC.

Only upon successful completion of the ADAP Online Program and passing the ADAP final exam with a score of 70% or higher, will you have access to your ADAP Certificate. A printed copy will need to be taken to the Department of Driver Services. The DDS will not be able to look it up online.

If your certificate is not found through this link, you either did not complete the course, did not pass the final exam or entered the incorrect information. If you failed to complete ADAP in 30 days, your account was deactivated and you must request an account reset by submitting an email with your full name, birthdate, User ID, and phone number to eADAPsupport@dds.ga.gov. If you do not pass ADAP in three (3) attempts, your User ID and password will be disabled and you must re-register to retake the course with a different personal email address.
