<u>Dash 2 How to_Assignment 1 - "Most important/significant"</u>

For Assignment 1, students have **four** responsibilities:

- 1. <u>Identify</u> the most important / significant could be a characteristic, policy, cause etc.
- 2. **Explain** why it is (they are) the most important.
- 3. Support your explanation with examples from Social Studies Content
- 4. **Communicate** in a well-organized response

The assignment will be scored out of a total of 10 marks.

- ✓ Explanations and Support (8 marks)
- ✓ Communication (2 marks)

A visual such as a puzzle, map, blocks, flags etc. will display about 10 characteristics. You must <u>identify</u>

1 to 3 correct characteristics that you believe are the most important. Not all the characteristics listed are correct; some options are incorrect.

The following should be considered a guide to help you complete the assignment. REMEMBER THERE IS **NO ONE WAY TO RESPOND** TO THIS ASSIGNMENT BUT **ALL THE PARTS MUST BE COMPLETED**.

1. Identify the characteristic/policy/cause you consider to be most important

- **a.** Ensure the characteristic/policy/cause is accurate
- **b.** Consider choosing ones you could provide the most examples of.
- **c.** Consider choosing one you know more about why it would be considered important

2. Explain why it is the most important

- a. Provide reasons why your choices are the most important. e.g.
- **b.** Provide examples from your knowledge of Social Studies to prove why your choices are the most important
- **c.** Be specific and don't generalize with your explanations!

3. Support your explanation with examples from Social Studies

- **a.** Support your choice with specific examples from class or current events (prove you were paying attention!)
- **b.** Use key terms from class in your response
- **c.** Evidence and examples provided should be specific and must be accurate.

4. Communication:

- **a.** You are not required to write an essay **but it must be in paragraph form**.
- **b.** Most students will probably write 3 paragraphs one for each characteristic/policy/cause
- **c.** Paragraphs have introductory sentences and concluding sentences.
- **d. Social Studies terminology & vocabulary** should be included you are marked on it.
- **e.** Ensure your writing is organized with grammar and mechanics corrected.
- **f.** Correct sentence structure is expected

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Explanation and Support (8 marks)

- Select one or more of the choices provided, make sure to choose items that are correct and relate to the question (there may be some incorrect options!)
- Support your choice with specific examples from class or current events (prove you were paying attention!)
- Use key terms from class in your response
- Prove that you clearly understand the issue being discussed

Mark (8)	Explanation	Support
Excellent (7 -8)	A complete and extensive understanding of the question. Student has shown a strong understanding of the issue being examined.	Evidence and Examples provided are specific and accurate, and errors, if present, do not detract from the response.
Proficient (6-7)	A clear understanding of the question. Student has shown a understanding of the issue being examined.	Evidence and Examples provided are relevant and appropriate, and may contain minor errors.
Satisfactory (5-6)	A general understanding of the question. Student has shown some understanding of the issue being examined.	Evidence and Examples provided are relevant and general, and may be incomplete, or contain errors.
