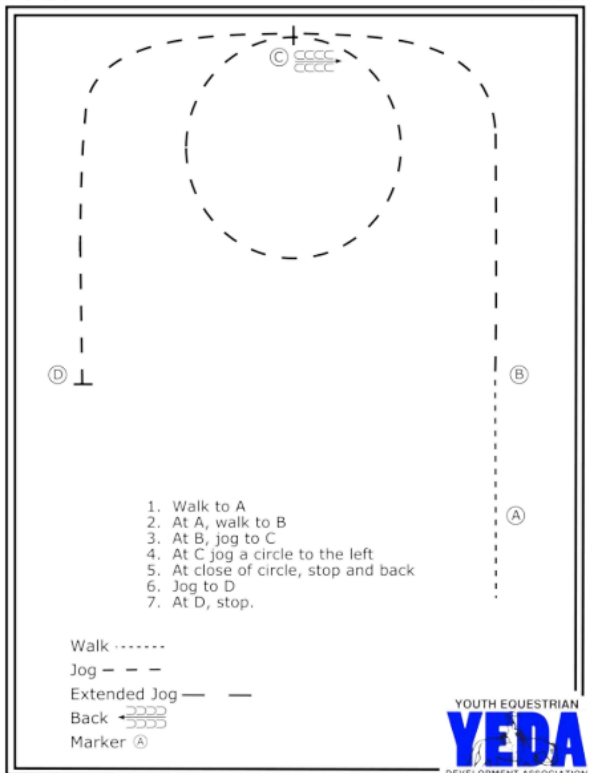
Amber EWD Walk Pattern 9,10



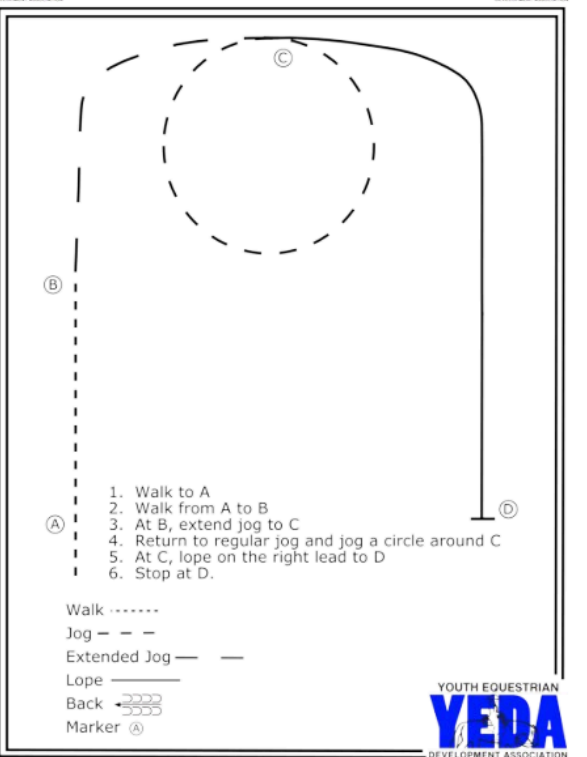
Topaz EWD W/T Pattern 9,10



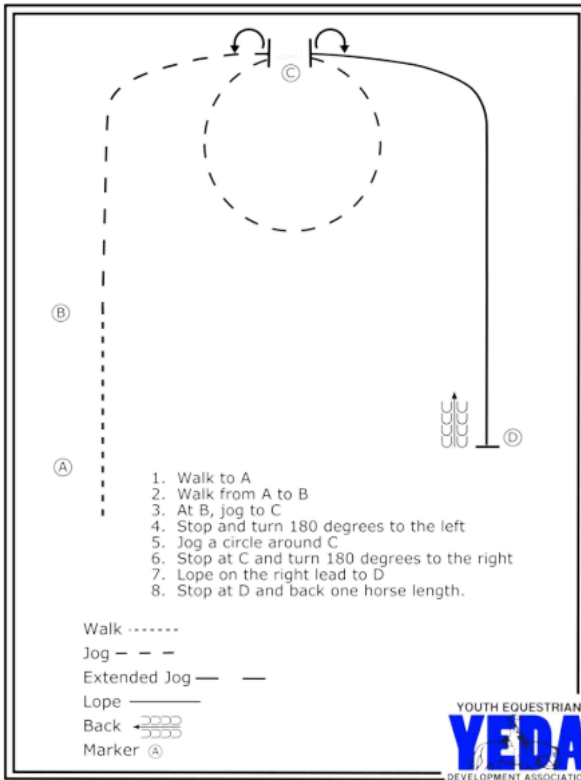
Pearl/Opal/Alumni Pattern 9



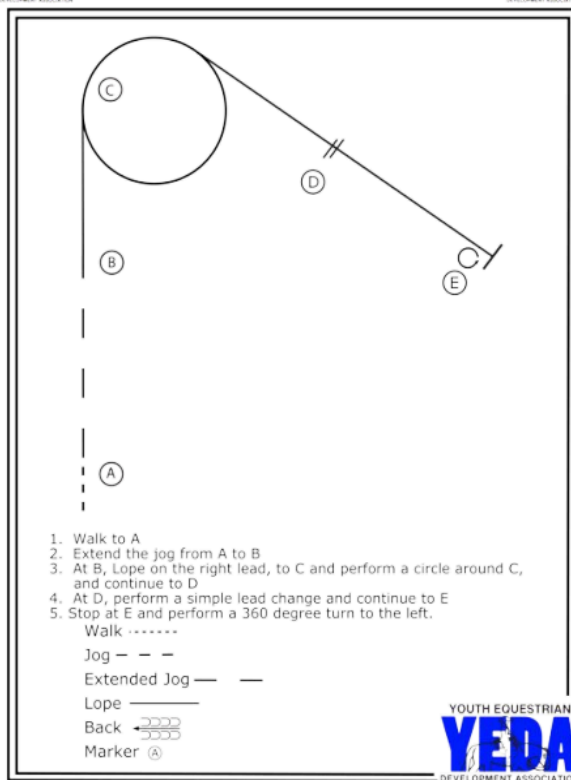

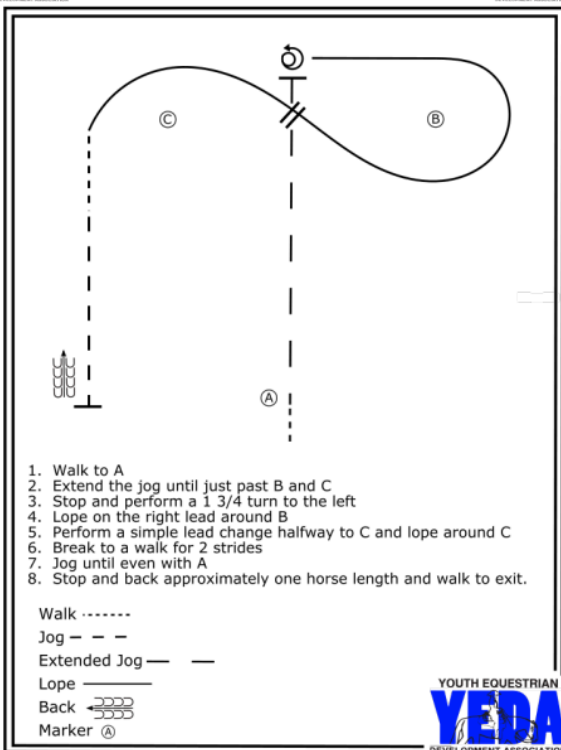
Ruby Pattern 9



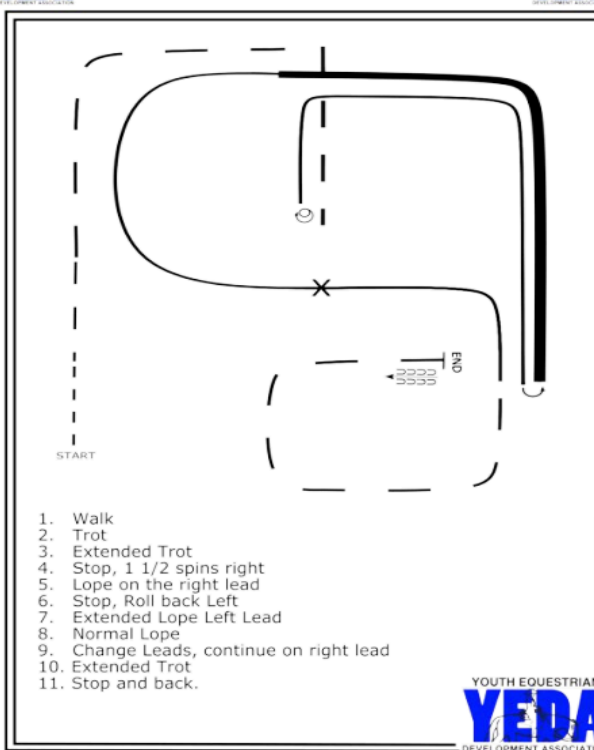
Sapphire/Alumni Pattern 9



Diamond Pattern 9

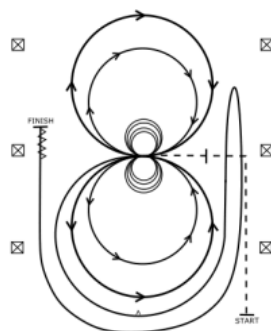


Ranch Riding Pattern 9

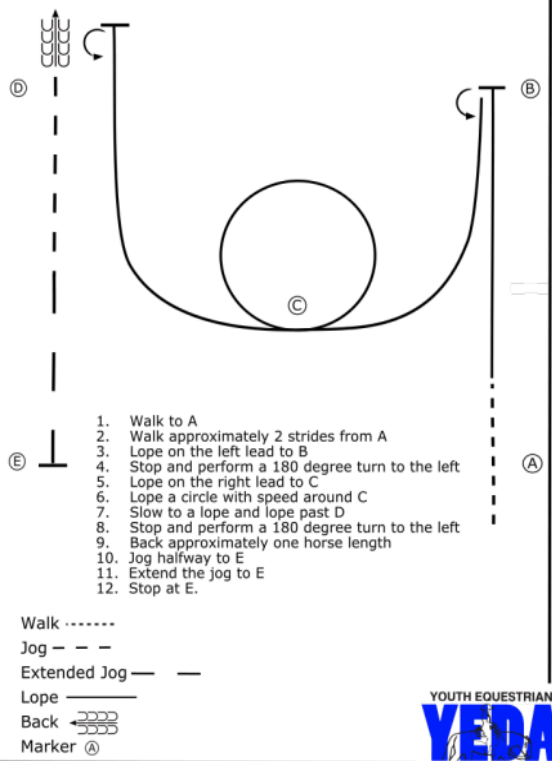

1. Jog to center of arena. Stop. Hesitate. Spin four spins to the right. Hesitate.
 2. Spin four spins to the left. Hesitate.
 3. Complete two circles to the left, the first small and slow, the second large and fast. Change leads at the center of the arena.
 4. Complete two circles to the right, the first small and slow, the second large and fast. Change leads at the center of the arena and head around the top of the arena but do not close the circle.
 5. Lope past the center cone and stop, then perform a right rollback.
 6. Lope around the end of the arena past the center cone and stop. Back.
- Hesitate to show completion of pattern.



1. Walk to A
2. Walk approximately 2 strides from A
3. Lope on the left lead to B
4. Stop and perform a 180 degree turn to the left
5. Lope on the right lead to C
6. Lope a circle with speed around C
7. Slow to a lope and lope past D
8. Stop and perform a 180 degree turn to the left
9. Back approximately one horse length
10. Jog halfway to E
11. Extend the jog to E
12. Stop at E.

Horse Descriptions

Horse name	Team name	Horse color/breed	1 or 2 hands	Spurs	Description
Andee	Buckeye Riders	Bay Gelding	1 Hand	Division appropriate	Lazy draw, make sure he gets off your leg. Keep straight in lead departures. Will collect up from your legs.
Boone	SOET	Bay roan gelding	1 or 2	none	Medium rein contact. Doesn't like to be trapped. Check back and release for slower jog; use voice commands along with cluck for jog (no need to kick), kiss for lope; maintain forward motion for flying lead change; lift reins, slight pull and squeeze for back, but release contact with verbal whoa to stop, or he will continue backing. Lift reins; use body and outside leg for turns and spins (use leg just before moving hand(s) left or right. Neck reins well, but two hand (option) may be preferred for more difficult patterns and/or Ranch Riding. Ride softly, as he gets anxious if you do. If saddle change is needed or when tightening the girth, have the handler hold his face closely, or he will nip at person touching his girth. Quiet motions when putting numbers in holders (very sensitive when near his flanks and may lift a leg, but doesn't kick out).

Carley	Dreaming Big	Sorrel paint mare	1 or 2	Division appropriate	easy going. Very lazy(loves naps) has spur stop.

Diesel	Hancock	sorrel gelding	2 hands	ball spurs only crop option	Straight forward horse, easy to ride. On the lazy side. Use your legs in rythm to keep him trotting. His trot is on the bumpy side. Make sure you set up for right lead and keep your legs on to keep him going in lead. Light to medium contact. The tightwe you pull the higher he will put his head.
Earl	Buckeye Riders	Sorrel gelding	2 Hand Option	Ball Spurs	Ride leg to hand. If he is pulling on hand, use legs to soften face (don't just pull harder). Anticipates roll backs to the left. Ask to stop (use hand but not too heavy in initial back up).
Eric	PDPH	Sorrel QH gelding	2	Division appropriate	Reiner/ranch horse type. Set up for right lead. Better if you go to voice before spur.

Gator	PDPH	Palomin o QH gelding	1	No spur	The best boy! Use voice to keep trotting. Crop option.
Gretel	Hancock	chestnut mare	one	Division appropriate	Light to medium contact. Ranch type horse. Set up for left lead and use strong leg cues when changing leads from right to left. She has a bumpier trot. Straightforward ride.

IKE	Hancock	Chestnut gelding	one	Division appropriate	Medium contact but have give and take with his face. Soften and find a release. Set up for right lead. keep him pushed forward for true gaits.
INDY	Hancock	Paint gelding	2 hands	ball spur only	Ranch Reiner type. Use strong leg to keep him loping. Takes leads well. Take legs off and sit deep to stop. Light to medium contact. Do not trap.
Jett	SOET	Black gelding	1 or 2	Division appropriate	Light rein contact and LOTS of leg/spur. If contact is too tight, he won't move forward. Use spurs according to division and if none are allowed, a crop is encouraged. If only ball spurs allowed, a crop is still an option. Cluck & kick for jog; Kiss & cue for lope. Increase forward motion for flying lead change. Can be very lazy but does very well with a confident rider not afraid to use legs or spurs. Continue kissing and consistent leg contact through lope if he gets too slow/uncollected. Use inside leg and body position to keep him from cutting corners in rail work. Two-hand option for short/weak legs or those not allowed spurs, as his steering is very leg dependent.

King	Buckeye Riders	Sorrel gelding	1 hand	Division appropriate	Soft/smooth hand & legs, keep engaged in circles to prevent swapping leads.
Latte	Buckeye Riders	Chestnut Mare	2 Hand Option	Ball Spurs	typically laid-back. Can get anticipatory in patterns particularly rundowns. Use soft hands and keep nose straight with body. Keep her moving forward using even leg pressure. Don't rush her with quick hand or motions.

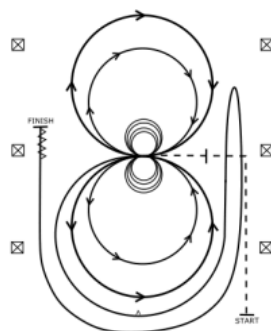


Ranch Riding Pattern 9

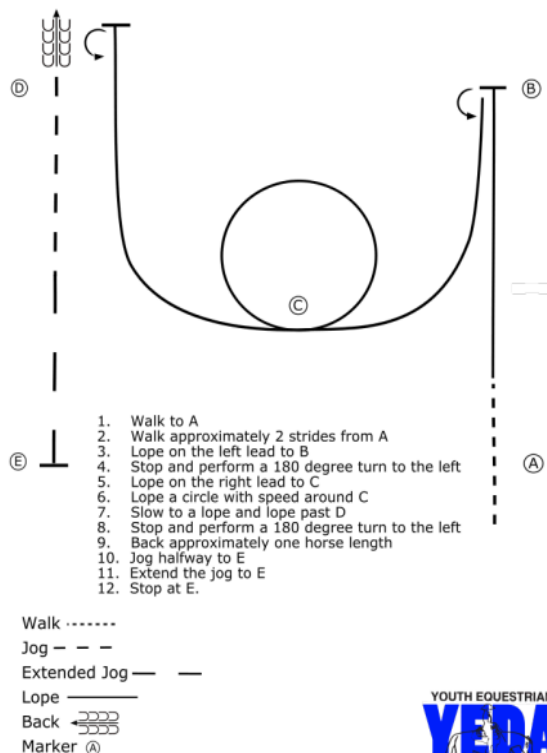
