

Retraction Form

This retraction form was designed to support editors when preparing a retraction notice, and help researchers analyse retractions. This template helps editors and journal managers understand whether an article meets the pre-requisites for the COPE retraction guidelines¹.

It consists of tick boxes and space for supporting clarification, to indicate who is retracting the article, the reason for the retraction and history of errata/ expressions of concern. A free text box allows the editor to add any information they consider useful, and a final Retraction Notice box is provided to summarise the details in the form into text to be published to announce the retraction.
