

Democratic Party of Sacramento County
Central Committee Meeting Minutes

6/9/2022 – DPSC Zoom

The meeting was called to order at about 6PM, the roll was taken as recorded in the roll call document with a quorum present.

Rosanna Herber led the pledge of allegiance.

No new members were present.

Katie Hanzlik went over the Code of Conduct for the meeting.

Terry Schanz stated that there was a typo in the April minutes for the vote on Sheriff Candidate Jim Cooper in that it should list Chair Tracie Stafford as the voting person, since she was present, rather than listing Chair Stafford's alternate, Kate Van Buren as the voting person, and that Ms. Van Buren was not listed as attending the meeting.

Kate Lenox asked why her resolution the CalPers divest from fossil fuels was not on today's agenda and Paco explained there weren't enough eboard yes votes by email to get it on the agenda and that it was not explicitly voted down with no votes, just not enough yes votes. P. Torres also stated that the same was true of the other resolution out of the Resolutions committee that did not make it on today's agenda.

David Mandel asked for a way to include these two resolutions that came out of Resolutions but that did not get enough votes by the eboard to make it on today's agenda.

David Mandel made a motion to discharge these two remaining resolutions from the eboard so that they could be added to tonight's agenda. The motion was seconded.

The motion failed to reach the two thirds threshold with a vote of 12 yes, 17 no.

The agenda and prior minutes were adopted by unanimous consent with the understanding that the prior minutes will be amended regarding the Cooper item mentioned above by T. Schanz.

Local elected officials and candidates were provided an opportunity to speak for 20 seconds each, many of whom did so.

The Chair made her report on the primary election early results and successes.

Vice Chair K. Hanzlik made the controllers report on behalf of Controller Belinda Beeks as follows for the State and Federal accounts.

Communications Committee Chair Paco Torres offered support to clubs and offered to add their meetings to the sacedm.org calendar and to promote their events and clubs.

T. Schanz mentioned the warning letters that were sent to elected officials who endorsed non-Democrats running against DPSC endorsed candidates, and that the body be informed of those elected officials who have been disqualified for endorsement for the next five years because they did not rescind their endorsement of non-Democrats as requested by DPSC in the warning letters.

The five elected officials who received the letters and refused to rescind their endorsement are:

Fundraising Committee Chair D. Weitzmann reported that Tuesday June 14th at noon will be the next committee meeting. He thanked the elected officials and candidates who made large contributions that helped out the DPSC slate of endorsed Democrats for the June 7th primary.

Alex Torres reported on behalf of Sam Corbin, Chair of the Legislative & Civic Engagement Committee. This report consisted of a presentation on the Tribal gaming initiatives. Alexandra Rooker spoke in favor of the tribal sports wagering act and against the online gaming initiative. Hannah De Groot of Californians for Tribal Sovereignty and Safe Gaming spoke against the online gaming initiative.

There was some discussion of the need for impartiality in presentations such as the one just presented on Tribal gaming.

Membership Committee Chair Mario Guerrero reported on the Membership Committee and mentioned a training on June 25th. He stated that the clubs were notified of the chartering requirements with a deadline of June 20th in time for the eboard to recommend to the July general meeting with an exception for those who miss that to resolve it by July 18th and then they would come up at the next meeting in August. If they don't pass by the August meeting then they could be suspended for three months. There is a grace period for the July meeting that they would still be able to vote there.

Resolutions Committee Chair Zach Freels reported that the two resolutions that didn't make it on the today's agenda that should be on the next meeting's agenda concern a moratorium on charter schools and divestment from fossil fuel holdings by CalPers. Mr. Freels extended an invitation to anyone who would like to participate in the Resolutions Committee on issues such as Roe V. Wade and gun violence.

Mr. Freels also stated that the Resolutions Committee requested that a discussion(s) be held in the DPSC general meeting on SMUD's solar policy and in other forums between now and the rest of the year.

Rules Committee Chair Joshua Cameron reported that by laws originally planned for a vote tonight have been postponed due to a last minute issue the CDP brought up with the DPSC bylaws which must be addressed first.

Various club reports were made.
