Many Internet museums have been developed around the world in the last decades. Computer History Museum in Mountain View and Internet Archive in San Francisco are among the first Internet museums founded in the 20th century [Wikipedia 2024; CHM 2024; Wikipedia 2024b].

Computer History Museum (CHM)

The Computer History Museum (CHM) may be the first museum dedicated to digital technologies. It was founded in Massachusetts in the 1970s and moved to California in the 1990s [Wikipedia 2024]. CHM has an extensive collection of digital technology, from abacuses to the Internet. The entire exhibition is also available online. The CHM Fellow Awards Program honors digital technology pioneers since 1987, with Grace Hopper as the first awardee. CHM also keeps the video interview archives of various pioneers.

Internet Archive

The Internet Archive is a nonprofit digital library founded in May 1996 [Wikipedia 2024c]. It is chaired by Brewster Kahle, who started archiving the World Wide Web through web crawling in 1996. The archive provides free access to various digitized materials, including websites, software programs, music, audiovisual files, and printed materials. In 2024, the archived pages were 735 billion. The Archive arranged to have parts of its collections at the Bibliotheca Alexandrina in Egypt and a facility in the Netherlands.

Nexon Computer Museum

Nexon Computer Museum was founded by Nexon in Jeju, South Korea, in the 2000s. The museum archives computers, game machines, and other digital artifacts.

World Internet Science and Technology Museum

World Internet Science and Technology Museum is one of the newest Internet museums, having opened in November 2023 in Wuzhen, China. It is one of the largest digital museums, with collections of Internet pioneers, including most Internet Hall of Fame inductees, and other artifacts.
