



AMGA Splitboard Guide Logo

Individuals who successfully pass the AMGA Ski Guide Exam on a splitboard are considered an **AMGA Splitboard Guide**, and may only use this term and logo when referring to their AMGA certification.

After passing the AMGA Advanced Ski Guide Course on a splitboard, individuals should only use the term **Assistant Splitboard Guide** when referring to their AMGA training level, and may not use the Splitboard Guide logo.

After completing the AMGA Ski Guide Course on a splitboard, individuals should only use the term **Apprentice Splitboard Guide** when referring to their AMGA training level, and may not use the Splitboard Guide logo.

For certified Splitboard Guides wishing to become an AMGA Ski Guide and/or IFMGA certified, it is required to be assessed to meet the AMGA ski movement standard. This can be accomplished while taking an AMGA Ski program on skis as well as a splitboard, or by setting up a ski movement assessment with an AMGA Instructor Team member after completing the Ski program on a splitboard. Similarly, any certified AMGA Ski Guide wishing to obtain a Splitboard Guide certification needs to be assessed to meet the AMGA splitboard movement standard to become an AMGA Splitboard Guide.

Once a Splitboard Guide is assessed to meet the AMGA ski movement standard, they may use the terms **AMGA Ski Guide** and/or **AMGA Splitboard Guide** as well as both associated logos when referring to their AMGA certifications.
