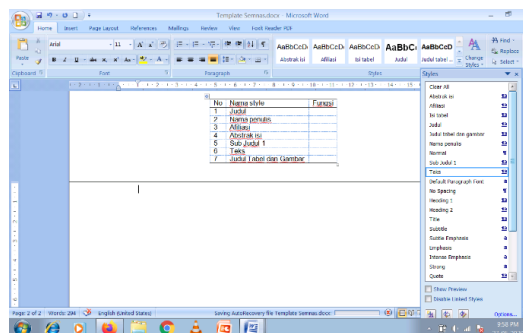


Figure 1. Bring Up Styles in a Template
