## **s8.10 - Termite Inspection Industry Concerns (and Suggestions)**

The Termite Inspection Industry is likely simpler to address than the Home Inspection industry given there is already a standardized reporting system, albeit archaic and difficult to follow without a little education and when incomplete reports are marked as complete.

## Suggestion - Buyer and Agent Certification on Termite Inspection Education

This is similar to the Home Inspection Report Education process suggested in another document.

- 1. **Videos** All Buyers MUST pay for and watch some type of detailed video (series) which conveys the job of a termite inspector, the expectations of a termite inspector and the possible conflicts a termite inspector faces when doing his job.
- 2. **In person follow up** There may also be a required in person / zoom followup session on a class or individual level for clarification of questions
- 3. **Prerequisite** This has to be done PRIOR TO engaging with any Termite Inspector and in fact it should be a requirement for all buyers BEFORE they can even actively engage with any Agent for showings
- 4. Requirement for Agents All Agents should be required to take the course and get certified too.
- 5. **Refresher Courses** Certification may be good for 5 or 10 yrs and refreshers may be required for Buyers (like a scuba certification)

## Suggestion - Federal or State Level Form Standardization

• The current report format is archaic. It may in fact be fine as long as there is education that is required to precede reading it. Don't bloat the report format.

## Suggestion - Major and Significant Penalties for Report Manipulation

With Buyer pre-education and standardized reporting a lot of stuff falls away. Those found omitting details on audits or as a result of alternative reports with enough standard format discrepancies need to be subject to public scrutiny, huge penalties, and./or public decided jail time.
