

Learning Mastery in Canvas

Canvas can help you track student progress on your course or program outcomes, but first you'll need to have things set up for your course.

Step 1: Enter or Find Outcomes.

Step 2: Add your Outcomes in your Rubrics

Step 3: Use the rubrics to assess students.


- Even if a student does well, don't skip the rubric and just give them a grade! For the data to be accurate, it all has to be entered!

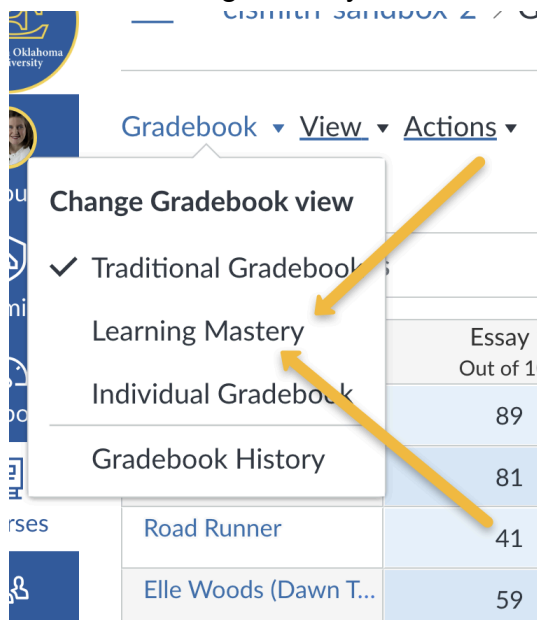

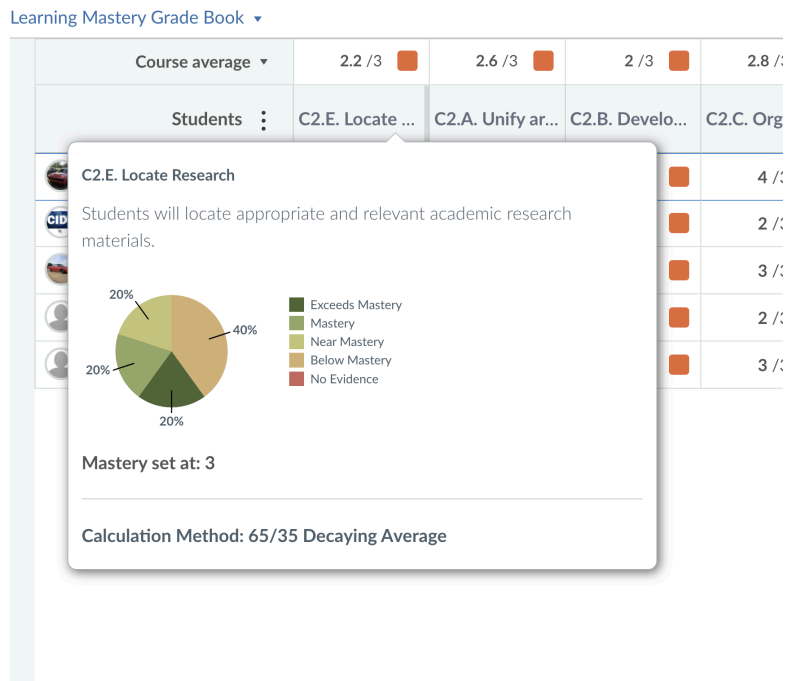

The report provides a color-coding system to identify students' progress on each outcome.


- Hovering over the name of an outcome provides additional insights for the class.
