\boldsymbol{A} Bill for an Act to Legalize Nuclear Energy , and for related purposes

The Parliament of Australia enacts:

Part 1—Preliminary

1 Short title

This Act is the Legalize Nuclear Energy Bill 2023

2 Commencement

(1) Each provision of this Act specified in column 1 of the table commences, or is taken to have commenced, in accordance with column 2 of the table. Any other statement in column 2 has effect according to its terms.

3 Schedules

Legislation that is specified in a Schedule to this Act is amended or repealed as set out in the applicable items in the Schedule concerned, and any other item in a Schedule to this Act has effect according to its terms.

4 Objects of this Act

The objects of this act are:

- (a) To remove the prohibition on nuclear fission in Australia
- (b) To allow investment into clean energy to get Australia off fossil fuels

5 Commonwealth to be bound

- (1) This Act binds the Commonwealth in all it's capabilities.
- (2) The Act does not make the Commonwealth liable to be prosecuted for an offence.

Schedule 1—Amendments

Part 1—Nuclear Energy Legalisation

Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Act 1999

1 Section 140A

Repeal the section, substitute:

140A Requirements for decisions about nuclear installations

- (1) In deciding whether or not to approve the taking of an action consisting of or involving the construction or operation of:
 - (a) a nuclear fuel fabrication plant;
 - (b) a nuclear power plant;
 - (c) an enrichment plant; or
 - (d) a reprocessing facility;

the Minister must not act inconsistently with:

- (e) Australia's obligations under the Paris Climate Accord; or
- (f) the preference for renewable sources of energy where applicable, including, but not limited to:
 - (i) solar power;
 - (ii) wind power;
 - (iii) hydro power;
 - (iv) tidal power;
 - (v) geothermal power.
- (3) The minister must not approve the taking of an action consisting of or involving the construction or operation of:
 - (a) a nuclear fuel fabrication plant;
 - (b) a nuclear power plant; or
 - (c) an enrichment plant; or
 - (d) a reprocessing facility;

without presenting a plan surrounding how the water requirements for these facilities will be met. (4) For the purposes of section 140A(3) the Minister must not approve a construction or operation of any of the listed facilities unless that facility has a water desalination plant operational to meet its water needs unless the facility operators present an adequate plan through the usage of water from the ocean for their related purposes.

 - (a) a nuclear fuel fabrication plant:
 - (b) a nuclear power plant;

the CEO must take into account the preference for renewable sources where applicable, including, but not limited to:

- (e) solar power;
- (f) wind power;
- (g) hydro power;
- (h) tidal power;
- (i) geothermal power.
