--Explanation--

The record for the Poundstone book was a bit difficult to locate because I was misled by the exemplars in the QB36 classification, Galileo, Copernicus, and Brahe (assuming they had limited value for the “aboutness” of the book, but after I checked the “breadcrumb” trail, assigning the book this classification made more sense. The Josephy book was fairly easy to find, but there were issues with the extra numbers after the decimal space. I was not able to locate an exact classification for the Green book (fiction) but came as close as possible to the aboutness of the book.
