what's on the line? -

Affordable Child Care

Childcare costs an average of \$10,000 annually, exceeding the cost of rent in many areas.

Paid Family and Medical Leave.

The U.S. is one of the only countries without national paid leave. **Only 1 in 4 workers** have access to paid family leave. Families need paid leave for when they have a new child, a serious illness, or an injury that prevents them from working.

Support for Care Workers.

Direct care workers who take care of disabled and older adults, as well as kids and teens, earn less than \$24,000 a year, and usually don't get benefits.

Paid Family and Medical Leave.

Nearly 690,000 people are waiting for Medicaid to help them get home care, so they don't have to move into a nursing home. Medicaid's Home and Community-based Services offer things like personal care, help with daily tasks, and home health services. Without this aid, long-term care can cost around \$50,000 annually.

Protecting Coverage for Millions of Americans

The Affordable Care Act (ACA) covers 45+ million Americans, and tax credits help lower costs. Most states have expanded Medicaid for people with the lowest incomes, bringing the number of uninsured people to an all-time low.

Promoting Fairness in Healthcare

The ACA has helped over **100 million people** by preventing overcharging, insurance denial, gender-based pricing, and service refusals.

Increasing Access to Healthcare

ACA provided affordable health coverage through private insurance and Medicaid for millions of Black and Brown Americans, ensuring access to healthcare regardless of race nationwide.

Protecting and Expanding Medicaid

Some have proposed to limit Medicaid funding, denying services to millions and cutting support for state programs. Policymakers are considering lifetime benefit caps and/or time limits, **potentially denying Medicaid to 18.5 million people**.

Preventing a Health Insurance Tax Increase

ACA tax credits help reduce premiums for those buying their own health insurance. Increased assistance saved the average person about \$700. This will end in 2025, potentially leaving millions without health care unless Congress votes to keep it.

- Not only does hunger affect people's health and well-being, it also has farreaching social effects.
- Hunger raises healthcare costs, makes it harder for children to focus in school, and reduces workplace productivity.



myth #1:

The average American isn't at risk of becoming homeless.

fact:

76% of Americans live paycheck to paycheck. On average, a single full-time job is not enough to cover monthly expenses.

Myth #2

Rates of homelessness in the U.S. are going down.

fact:

In the past year, homelessness rose by 12% overall, 16% for families with children, and 15% for youth living on their own

Myth #3

People facing homelessness are lazy, unmotivated, and don't want to work.

fact:

Over 50% of those in shelters and 40% of the unsheltered are employed.

policy solutions?

Focus on helping renters with low incomes.

Only one in four renters who are eligible for federal housing assistance can get it. Without stable housing, people have difficulty finding and keeping jobs or getting education and healthcare. The harm to families can be long-lasting.

Establish a national renter tax credit.

Homeowners currently receive tax benefits, but renters need help too. A national renter tax credit would give money to families whose housing costs exceed 30% of their income, helping more families than current rental assistance programs.

what else?

Create a better definition for homelessness.

Our current definition leaves out millions of children and youth. We need to collect accurate data and provide better assistance to children & youth in unstable living situations.

Register more low-income voters.

82% of high-income earners registered to vote in 2022, compared to only 57% of low-income earners. We need more low-income registered voters to vote for politicians that prioritize their interests

Some politicians are focused on giving huge tax cuts to the ultra-rich, while people with the lowest incomes are struggling to make ends meet.

Next year, Congress will take up major tax legislation, giving us an opportunity to put human needs first.

There are lots of things that Congress do to provide support for the hard-working people and families who need it most.

Expand the Child Tax Credit (CTC).

The Child Tax Credit (CTC) helps families with the cost of raising kids, and Congress needs to expand it again. In 2021, the expanded CTC cut child poverty in half. Today, families making over \$400,000 a year get more from the CTC than those earning around \$15,000, leaving 19 million kids without full benefits.

Support the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).

The EITC provides extra money to low-income people when they file taxes. Together, the EITC and CTC lifted 6.4 million people from poverty in 2023. Congress needs to expand the EITC to prevent low-wage workers from being taxed into poverty, including younger workers and those without children.

what else?

Tax the Ultra-Rich.

In the past six years, 26 billionaires paid an average of 4.8% in taxes, while many working families paid 37%. At the same time, the wealth of 741 billionaires in America grew by \$2.3 trillion. If billionaires paid their fair share, it would help reduce the wealth gap and fund important programs for people in need.

Raise the Minimum Wage.

The federal minimum wage hasn't been raised since 2009, and millions of workers are struggling to make ends meet. Congress needs to raise wages to make sure all workers – including tipped workers and people with disabilities -- are paid fairly.

Right now, our voting rights are under attack. In 2023, *14 states created 17 laws* that make it harder to register and vote, mostly affecting voters of color.

At the same time, powerful, anonymous donors — often billionaires and corporations — are secretly spending a lot of money to influence elections.

Their goal? To sway outcomes in their favor, often at the expense of the public's voice.

The Power of your Vote

In 2020, the presidential election in WI, AZ, and GA was decided by just 42,918 votes combined.

What can we do?

Register Crucial Voters: We need more registered voters, especially those who come from marginalized communities, like low-income individuals, people of color, and people with disabilities.

Protect and Expand Voting Rights: Elect leaders who support laws like the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act and the Freedom to Vote Act. These laws will help strengthen parts of the Voting Rights Act, ensure all eligible voters can register and vote, restore voting rights for those who have completed felony sentences, and take bold steps to eliminate dark money from politics.
