



If you are a resident of the Marysville Exempted Village School District and are interested in enrolling your home schooled child in the district on a part-time basis in grades 5-12, please follow the steps outlined below.

Step 1:

Your child must be approved for home schooling by the district for the school year in which you are wishing to enroll and your child must be in grades 5-12.

Step 2:

Contact your child's school counseling department to discuss the class options.

Step 3:

Complete this [Google form](#).

Step 4:

Visit the [Enrollment site](#) on the Marysville Schools website and complete all 5 steps of the enrollment process.

Other Information:

Once you receive an email from our Enrollment Specialist, stating your enrollment process has been completed, the school will reach out to you in order to schedule possible classes based on class capacity availability. The timing of this schedule collaboration with the school will depend on the time of year you are enrolling.

Admission of Students from Non-Chartered or Home Schooling

Students seeking admission into the District's schools who have been enrolled in non-chartered schools or home schooling programs may be required to take competency examinations. The purpose of these examinations is to determine the proper grade placement for these students.

In making a placement decision, the Superintendent may consider:

1. the student's most recent annual academic assessment report;

2. whether to require the student to take any or all of the nationally normed, standardized achievement tests that are regularly scheduled for District students of similar age and
3. other evaluation information that may include interviews with the student and the parent.

Resident students attending a non-chartered nonpublic school are permitted to participate in the District's extracurricular activities at the school to which the student would be assigned if the non-chartered nonpublic school the student is enrolled in does not offer the extracurricular activity. Students must be of the appropriate age and grade level as determined by the Superintendent and must fulfill the same academic, nonacademic and financial requirements as any other participant.

Resident students receiving home instruction in accordance with State law are permitted to participate in District extracurricular activities at the school to which the student would be assigned. Students must be of the appropriate age and grade level as determined by the Superintendent and must fulfill the same academic, nonacademic and financial requirements as any other participant.

Although students choosing home schooling are not the direct responsibility of the Marysville Exempted Village School District, the Board and staff share an interest in their education; therefore, the District will permit students receiving home schooling access to certain services from the District as follows:

- Students must be of the appropriate age and grade level as determined by the Superintendent/designee and must fulfill the same academic, nonacademic and financial requirements as any other participant.
- Home schooled students who are enrolled on a part-time basis may participate in field trips or cocurricular activities related to the courses for which they are enrolled.
- Athletic eligibility will be determined by OHSSA guidelines and District policy.
- Transportation is the responsibility of the parent/guardian.
- Home schooled students in grades 5 - 6 may enroll on a part-time basis all school year, with a maximum of 1 unified arts course based on class capacity availability.
- Home schooled students in grades 7 - 8 may enroll on a part-time basis all school year, with a maximum of 2 elective courses based on class capacity availability.
- Home schooled students in grades 9 - 12 may enroll on a part-time basis all school year at Marysville High School, with a maximum of 2 elective and or core academic courses based on class capacity availability.

Enrollment in the above course(s) are considered enrichment. Home schooled students are still required to receive the mandatory 900 minimum hours of home education each school year.

Home schooled students are not eligible to participate in the College Credit Plus via the district and interested students must apply via the Ohio Department of Education.

Part-time enrollment for home schooled students in grades Pre-K through grade 4 is prohibited.
