The Korean national basketball team won 96-62 against the Thai national basketball team in the first round of the 2025 FIBA Asia Cup at Wonju Gymnasium on Saturday. Korea has one win and one loss overall in Group A. It ranks second in Group A after Australia with three points.

Ra Gun-ah (199 cm tall, C) ended what could be her last game for the Korean national team with a victory. She performed well with 15 points, six rebounds, and one block shot for 17 minutes and 10 seconds.

"I didn't shake. I did what I could. The young players did a great job. I played with confidence. I burst my potential. I am grateful to everyone. He showed ups and downs in his performance. Nevertheless, he sent me a passionate torch. I will continue to be a fan of Korea."

"I hope Korea does as well as it does now. It is moving in the right direction. It has shown its potential in the last two games. You just have to do as well as you do now," he added.

Ra's national team contract ends as of May 31. Ra has made sure that she wants to continue wearing the Korean uniform.

"I hope to renew my contract. It is up to the KBL and the association to decide on my contract," he said.

Meanwhile, Park Moo-bin (184 cm, G) even scored the first goal in his national team debut match. It must have been all the more meaningful because it was his debut match held in his hometown of Wonju.

"It's an honor to be selected for the national team. I made my debut in Wonju, my hometown. It was all the more meaningful. Coach Ahn Jun-ho told me to prepare for the game as I will start from the beginning after the half-time ends. I was sitting all the time and then started the game. I felt heavy, and I was out of breath. I felt better in the fourth quarter," he said.

"I failed all four of my first field throws because of my skills. My brothers tried to make me score the first goal. I felt heavy. I didn't have any greed to show off my offense. I promised not to make mistakes in defense." (Kim) Jong-gyu gave me a good pass. That's why I was able to score my first goal."

Korea is successfully undergoing generational change. Young guards including Park Moo-bin (187 cm, G) and Byun Joon-hyung (185 cm, G) are making progress.

"Young ones like Byeon Jun-hyeong and Lee Jung-hyun are serving as the main guards in their teams. I think (the coach) saw me well in the trend of generational change. I will do well in my team and continue to work for the national team," he said.

Lastly, he said, "I learned a lot from the national team. I didn't play in the game for a long time, but it was a good experience just watching the match against Australia. I will develop into a player that the coach can trust and use."
