Articles must be written on A4 size paper with dimensions of 210 mm wide and 297 mm long. Margins should be set at the following sizes:

Articles must be written in two columns with a single line spacing. Paragraphs are written justified left and right. The entire article must be written in Nunito font size 10pt. The title of the article is written in Nunito font size 12pt. The author's name is written in Nunito 10pt. Author affiliations are written in Nunito font size 8pt. Corresponding authors must include an email address. Article titles and abstracts must be written in one column (single column) and aligned left and right. Writing the author's name without including any title.




Figure 1. Example of 1 column image format (Font Nunito 11 pt)
