Social Studies: AP Human Geography

**Purpose of the Document:** This document provides an overview of this course. The information provided below is designed to support students, parents, and the school community to understand the major content of the course and the standards used to design it. **Program Vision:** Our vision is to foster a society of informed, skilled, engaged and productive citizens.

Course Description: This course provides college-level instruction in a high school setting. Human Geography is the study of where humans and their activities and institutions such as ethnic groups, cities, and industries are located and why they are there. By analyzing geography, population, cultural patterns, organization of space, land use, industrial and economic development students will gain a better understanding of the world they live in. Through inquiry, students will read extensively from primary and secondary source documents and practice technical writing to prepare for the AP exam. To earn an AP weighted high school credit, students enrolled in an AP course must take the College Board exam administered at the conclusion of the course.

## **Topics at-a-Glance**

<u>Unit 1: Thinking Geographically -</u> Students will learn about the tools and method geographers use in their study of place

<u>Unit 2: Population and Migration Patterns and Processes</u> - Students will explore the patterns associated with human populations.

<u>Unit 3: Cultural Patterns and Processes</u> - Students will focus on how and why language, religion, and other cultural practices spread over space and time.

<u>Unit 4: Political Patterns and Processes</u> - Students will build on their knowledge of populations and cultural patterns as you learn about the political organization of the world.

Unit 5 Agriculture and Rural Land-Use Patterns and Processes- Students will learn where

humans first developed agriculture and how farming practices spread throughout the word.

<u>Unit 6: Cities and Urban Land - Use Patterns and Processes-</u> Students will explore the origins and influences of urbanization, examining cities across the world and the role of those cities in globalization.

<u>Unit 7: Industrial and Economic Development Patterns and Processes</u> - Students will study the origins and influences of industrialization, along with the role industrialization plays in economic development.

  - How physical geography influences farming practices
  - The origins and spread of agriculture

  - Globalization and cities
  - City infrastructure
