(To be followed strictly by all submitting authors)

Double-Blind Note:

Do **not** include any author-identifying information in the manuscript. Author details (names, ORCID IDs, affiliations, emails) will be submitted separately during the online submission process.

1. Title Page *(separate file, not part of the main manuscript, name it ‘author details’)*

Include the following in the title page:

- Full Title (concise and descriptive)
- Author Names (First Last), Affiliation
- ORCID ID (e.g., 0000-0002-1825-0097)
- Email address for each author
- Indicate the *Corresponding Author*

2. Abstract (Maximum 150 words)

- Summarize the research question, methods, main findings, and significance.
- Avoid citations.
- Use one paragraph, no headings.

Keywords: (List 4–6 terms, separated by semicolons)

MAIN ARTICLE(Separate file, name ‘main Article’)

3. Introduction (Max 1000 words)

- Context and background of the issue
- Research gap and justification
- Research objectives or questions
- Significance and contribution of the study
- Literature Review

4. Methods (Max 1200 words)

Organize under relevant subheadings:

- **Study Design**
- **Population and Sample** (inclusion/exclusion criteria)
- **Tools / Instruments** (with citations)
- **Data Collection Procedure**
- **Analytical Framework / Models / Variables**
- **Ethical Considerations** (including approval reference)

5. Results (Max 800 words)

- Present empirical findings only.
- Use tables and figures where appropriate.
- Do not interpret or discuss results here.

Tables and Figures must be numbered (e.g., Table 1) and titled clearly. Use APA 7 formatting. Place each table/figure immediately after the paragraph where it's mentioned.

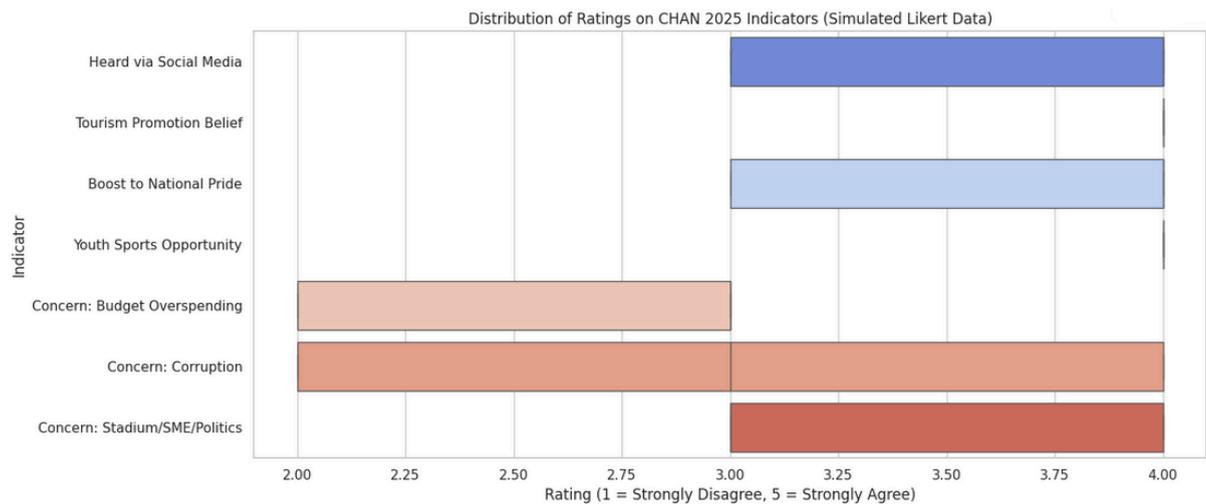

How to Place These in a Manuscript

- **Tables and figures must appear after the paragraph in which they are first referenced.**
- **APA 7 requires a clear title in italics, sentence case, above the table or figure,** followed by a note if applicable.
- **Do not place tables/figures in text boxes in Word;** use plain formatting.
- **All visuals must be referenced in-text,** e.g., "As shown in Table 1..." or "Figure 1 displays..."

6. Discussion (Max 1500 words)

- Interpret key findings
- Compare with previous literature
- Implications for theory, policy, or practice
- Limitations of the study
- Future research directions

7. Conclusion (Max 350 words)

- Recap the aim and whether it was met
- Final reflections on findings
- Implications and recommendations

8. Acknowledgements (Optional)

- Funding, institutional support, or personal contributions (no author names in manuscript)

9. References

- Follow **APA 7th Edition** referencing style
- All sources cited in the text must appear in the references
- Recent journal sources (last 10 years), preferably with impact factor or indexed in ESCI/SCOPUS
- At least 50% should be from peer-reviewed journals indexed in ESCI, Scopus, or have an Impact Factor
- Reference range:
 $2 * \text{number of pages} \leq \text{References} \leq 3 * \text{number of pages}$
(e.g., for 12-page paper: between 24 and 36 references)

 **If Evidence-Based Research or Practice, include:**

- Research claim or testable hypothesis
- Target population
- PICO framework (Population, Intervention, Comparison, Outcome)

10. Appendices (if applicable)

- Survey instruments, ethics certificates, supplementary data
