A Resolution Calling for The Re-Evaluation & Potential Expansion of Current Contact Tracing Methods

INTRODUCED BY: SENATOR JJ TIE OF THE SENIOR CLASS

SPONSORED BY: SENATOR RAJ BHATT OF THE FRESHMAN CLASS, SENATOR MEGAN CHIEN OF THE JUNIOR CLASS

REFERRED TO THE SENATE BY THE **COMMITTEE ON HEALTH, SAFETY, AND SUSTAINABILITY** WHICH RECOMMENDS ITS **PASSAGE** BY A UNANIMOUS VOTE OF **5** TO **0**.

**Whereas** The Johns Hopkins University, in its FAQ section of COVID information web page, promised to require "comprehensive COVID safety measures on campus, including face

coverings, physical distancing, limits on gatherings, enhanced cleaning protocols and self-monitoring for symptoms;" and

**Whereas** due to a concerning cluster among Homewood undergraduate students (58 cases as of Feb 4, 2021), all in-person activities were suspended from February 4th to 11th, 2021 and new restrictions such as 5-person limit on undergraduate gatherings and mandatory 3x/week testing were instituted; and

Whereas Johns Hopkins University has actively searched for effective ways to deal with the public health crisis given that the recent COVID cluster was met with harsh consequences; and

**Whereas** increased contact tracing would lead to a meaningfully more <u>effective</u> response to COVID outbreaks, thereby reducing the number of exposures and, by extension, the risk of quarantine and isolation accommodations filling up; and

**Whereas** Johns Hopkins University officially recognizes the benefits of contact tracing and <u>encourages</u> the collaboration to solve the "ethical, legal, policy, and governance issues that must be addressed as digital contact tracing technologies are developed and implemented", and

**Whereas** automatic contact tracing--possibly with private location sharing--would improve public health outcomes with <u>Georgia Tech implementing a contact tracing policy</u>, schools like <u>Amherst</u> and <u>Brown</u> making significant progress towards implementing digital contact tracing, and <u>Harvard</u> facilitating meaningful conversation;

**Therefore, Be It Resolved** that the Johns Hopkins Student Government Association encourages President Ronald Daniels, Provost Sunil Kumar, and Vice Provost Kevin Shollenberger to:

- A. Reevaluate the use of current and potential contact tracing technologies; and,
- B. Provide campus-wide educational resources about what contact tracing does and doesn't do in term of privacy access, and provide educational resources on who contact tracing information gets shared with; and,
- C. Further list out and specify disciplinary actions on violation of COVID-related rules; and,

**Be It Further Resolved** that a meeting between appropriate administrators and SGA members is strongly encouraged to discuss the possibility of the university adopting anonymous location sharing strategies as part of its COVID safety measures, while fully utilizing existing resources like Prodensity.
