Recommendations from Executive Summary of report:

Suggestion to work on recommendations highlighted green and purple

- Analyze and visualize existing sources and applications of linked data in existing workflows.
- Engage and integrate the perspectives of those handling the data throughout those workflows.
- Articulate priorities for linked data implementation to narrow scope and define phases.
- Identify relevant content creation workflows and opportunities to optimize linked data creation.
- Employ programmatic approaches to reconciling, updating and creating records in Alma and Wikidata to scale up linked data initiatives.
- Build out staff knowledge and awareness of linked data value.

Working on selected recommendations:

"Tactical steps such as determining what documented workflows exist and updating them collaboratively are useful exercises that bring groups together to ask questions and learn. Cross-organizational groups can focus on understanding the flow of the data and any processes or transformations affecting the bibliographic record, for example along the way."

- 1. Review and draw inspiration from <u>UPenn Linked Data Framework</u> and <u>University of</u> <u>Alberta implementation plan</u>
- 2. Review relevant internal documentation (e.g. UTL Metadata Steering Committee report/diagrams)
- 3. Identify existing linked data and potential linked data creation opportunities
- 4. Draft diagrams similar to UPenn and UAlberta
- 5. Identify staff/groups to engage in review/analysis
- 6. Explore and test efficient workflow adjustments

"...outlining a linked data strategy, defining "what's in it for me" for users is a key step in engagement. While it takes time to build trust - whether in data, people, systems or tools - messaging how roles might change and what benefits may be conferred is critical."

Build out staff knowledge and awareness of linked data value.

- 1. Review and draw inspiration from <u>UPenn Linked Data Framework</u> and <u>University of</u> <u>Alberta implementation plan</u>
- 2. Review and draw inspiration from recent OCLC position paper
- 3. Track and communicate ExLibris development of LD features in Alma/Primo
- 4. Addressing pain points in staff buy-in understanding of linked data value:
 - a. Clearly distinguish implementation of linked data URIs from implementation of BIBFRAME
 - b. Cooperative cataloging practices vs open collaborative editing of Wikidata
- 5. Develop relevant and resonant illustrations of benefits of linked data, using local or familiar examples.
- 6. Create opportunities to communicate/showcase linked data initiatives at UT Austin and beyond

Related points to consider

- Emphasis on special collections and items unique to UT
- Integrate Wikidata entry creation and reconciliation tasks [or any other linked data creation tasks] efficiently into cataloging and finding aid workflows.
