Course Description: The Career Studies Internship Program is a two credit course designed to assist students to gain work experience in their specific career pathway of focus and to assist students to successfully transition from high school to the next phase of their adult lives. This course is for students who anticipate to begin their chosen careers immediately upon high school graduation as well as those who will begin some sort of post-secondary education prior to starting their career.

The design of this course incorporates a strong business and/or industry partnership that connects topics learned in class with relevant work experiences provided by either an apprenticeship or internship. Students are provided with current resources and guidance from both business, industry, and education professionals. This course provides students with intense competency-based classroom and work-site instruction specifically tailored to meet the needs of the individual student. It also fosters the articulation of programs between high school and post-secondary education, credit-granting institutions, and apprenticeship programs. A post-graduation monitoring system is incorporated into instruction that identifies and addresses the students' ongoing needs as they advance toward their identified career goal.

Work Requirements: Students are required to work 120 hours per semester, for a total of 240 hours for the school year. Semester 1 (August - December) and Semester 2 (January - May) *Failure to meet work hour requirements may result in dismissal from the program.*

Classroom Requirements: Students are required to attend 18 hours of instructions per semester, for a total of 36 hours for the school year. Semester 1 (August - December) and Semester 2 (January - May) You will attend class on the dates set by your instructor. *Failure to meet classroom requirements may result in dismissal from the program.*

Late Work: The expectation is that assigned work is turned in by the due date to allow for feedback. *Failure to turn in assignments on time may result in reduced points or no credit for the assigned work*
