Parent/Guardian Curriculum Preview

High School (9th-12th) Curricula Lesson Covering Fentanyl

As a reminder, this curriculum is not related to SB 9 topics that require parent/guardian consent. LISD schools will use the Fentanyl curriculum from the Texas JCDTF in the Spring Semester for 9th-12th grade.

- The purpose of this lesson is to provide increasing awareness of and the perception of harm of the synthetic opioid Fentanyl and its devastating impact on individuals, families, and our communities.
- This lesson will educate students so that they are better equipped to make informed decisions when faced with a substance abuse or misuse scenario.
- This lesson is provided by the Texas Joint Counterdrug Task Force (JCDTF) Drug Demand Reduction Outreach (DDRO), and is called the "Dead on Arrival (DOA) Fentanyl lesson."
- Though Lewisville ISD is committed to spending the month of October to promote awareness and intervention of substance abuse through our Red Ribbon Campaign (RRC), this additional lesson will be taught during the spring semester to keep the conversation going throughout the year.
