Alaska INBRE Investigators Receive Seven Administrative Supplement Awards

We can't say it enough, Alaskan researchers rock! The NIH National Institute of General Medical Sciences (NIGMS) awards Administrative Supplement opportunities to develop collaborations between investigators, purchase equipment, address critical issues of women's health, and surveillance studies of SARS-CoV-2 viral strains. Since 2019 the Alaska INBRE program has received seven Administrative Supplements totaling \$2,028,441.
