Detailed Description:

This building is built from stone and bricks and is 4 storeys high. It is unusual because of its curved frontage. The first reference to this building is in 1784, it has had a number of uses, originally the building had a straight front, however according to the Harbour Board's Sketch Map of 1838 this was replaced by a curved front making this building unusual. Between 1818-1832 the building was used as a drapers (Hebron's Linen), in 1834 George Marston also ran a drapers from this building however by 1838 the building was labelled Fenwick. The OS map of 1852 (surveyed 1849) shows that the Post Office had also moved into this privately owned building, it stayed there until 1962, business was conducted through the window with customers standing on the pavement. A clock was installed in 1860. Other uses of this building include a chemist and a photographer's studio. In 1929 National Provincial Bank took over the building, They were replaced by NatWest in 1968. The building is currently occupied by Wendy's.
