READ	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Select a fiction or nonfiction book that is at or above your reading level.<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ You are encouraged to look at several end-of-year “Best of” lists and/or ask your friends and relatives for recommendations. Ultimately, however, it’s your choice. Before you commit to the book, read a few pages in the beginning and middle to see if you like the author’s style.◦ It must be a book you have not read previously.
WHILE YOU’RE READING	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Give the book a chance.<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ If you’ve fallen out of love with reading in years past, give yourself the opportunity to fall back in love with it. If you’ve continued to be a reader over the years, give yourself time to continue to grow your reading identity.
AFTER YOU’RE FINISHED READING	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Be prepared to work with the book.<ul style="list-style-type: none">◦ There will be an assignment to complete upon your return to school.

Purchasing the book is not required. Borrowing a book, such as from the Cincinnati Public Library, is totally cool. Listening to an audiobook is also totally cool. **Either way, you will need to have access to a hard copy or ebook version of the book at the beginning of the school year.** So, extend that library borrowing period as long as you can or—if you’ve chosen the audiobook route—request a hard copy or ebook version early enough so you have it for the first month of school.
