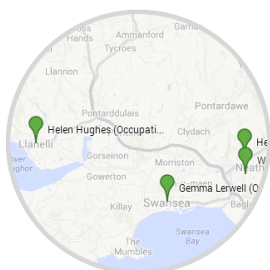

Required to analyse the data from the assessments together with information gathered from parents/teachers to create a client centred, functional and complex report with appropriate and practical advice for all involved with the children. Advise included compensatory strategies, physical activities to develop motor coordination and core strength, environmental adaptations and strategies for sensory processing difficulties. Commonly were requested to provide evidence from assessments for Paediatricians to make a diagnosis of Dyspraxia and Sensory Processing Difficulties.
