Description	Act
Great Britain gave the British East India Company a complete monopoly over the tea trade.	
Law passed in response to the Boston Tea Party! A. closing down Boston harbor B. Contributed to the calling of the First Continental Congress.	
Colonists organized boycotts of British goods! Sons of Liberty formed. TAX on any paper goods.	
TAX on lead, paint, and glass (manufactured goods)	
Forced colonists to house and feed British soldiers!	
LAW stating the colonists could not settle West of the Appalachian Mountains!

Description	Event
a. American soldiers spend a cold winter in this area! Many died of sickness, disease or starvation. Diary entry written about experience! Washington kept troops motivated!	
b. Final major battle in Virginia. Captured two British Generals! Abigail Adams wrote a letter to her husband describing the victory!	
c. 1 st Battle. "Shot Heard Round the World" No one knows who fired the first shot! Newspapers were bias in their point of view!	
d. Great Britain recognized the independence of the United States. Officially <u>ended</u> the war. America gets all land to the Mississippi River!	
e. Battle in New York. Turning point! <u>Foreign</u> recognition from France! Money, Guns, Troops, and Ships provided for Americans!
