Eagle Point Elementary School recognizes safe, responsible, and respectful student behaviors with Eagle Feather awards!

What is a Feather award?

Staff members award “feathers” to students when they demonstrate safe, responsible, and respectful behaviors. Students who earn a feather will be notified by the staff member that recognized the positive behavior. These feathers will be collected in grade-level containers and will be drawn from each Monday or first day of the week. The students that have their feathers drawn will be able to pick an intrinsic prize.

Why use Feather awards?

We recognize that the majority of EPES students make positive decisions all day long, which ultimately contributes to a great culture that builds a strong community in our school. Our goal is to recognize the many great things that students do in our school using the Feather system. We believe that reminding students that we value their help in building our school culture - and acknowledging specific things that they do - will make the school experience better for everyone!

What types of things can students be acknowledged for?

If it is a positive behavior that somehow promotes responsibility, respect, or safety it could be acknowledged. An example might include opening a door for another student, helping a new student find her next classroom, or picking up paper in the hallway. Put simply, when students choose to do the right things, we'll do our best to acknowledge it!
