Journalistic writing is all about being CLEAR and CONCISE

- Be aware of repeating times, dates, etc.
- Use descriptive adjectives when they are needed and serve a useful purpose.
- Stronger adjectives usually require fewer words and pack a bigger punch
- Try not to be too wordy: "the, will be, has been, is going, this is, which is, really, very, many, to get to"

INCORRECT aka BAD

"The <u>student body</u> is <u>getting ready</u> for the football game <u>that is coming up Friday evening</u> at 7 p.m. tomorrow.

The SGA <u>will be</u> collecting <u>colorful</u> pink socks at the charity fair <u>tonight at 6:30 p.m.</u> <u>to donate to local hospitals in order to show</u> Breast Cancer awareness."

Along with physically <u>feeling tired and sick all the time</u>, Smith <u>mentally dealt</u> with <u>serious</u> depression <u>while</u> undergoing chemotherapy <u>because</u> he <u>could not really</u> do much <u>and</u> felt <u>really</u> left out by his friends <u>and</u> alone.

Less words can/WILL have more impact!

CORRECT

Students are preparing for tomorrow's 7 o'clock football game.

"In honor of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, <u>SGA</u> <u>will collect</u> pink socks <u>for local hospitals</u> at the charity fair <u>tonight</u>.

The <u>physical effects</u> of chemotherapy <u>led to Smith's mental struggle</u> with depression <u>and</u> loneliness. *He **felt** like a burden on his parents <u>and</u> **felt** forgotten by his friends.

(*Parallelism, or similar sentence structure, helps the flow and impact of the second sentence)

DO NOT EDITORIALIZE

(do not put yourself or your opinion in the story)

To easily avoid editorializing: "Blame" the thoughts/feelings/opinions on others

According to [Name], everyone seemed to have a good time.

For [Name], driving safely is important.

[Name] thought/believes/hopes

In transitions, do NOT state the obvious OR repeat the quote

After being asked, Smith describes why he loves making toys.

INSTEAD use pieces of the quote:

Ever since Smith got into woodworking, <u>he wanted</u> to find a way to make people smile.

"I love making toys to gift or donate to others because they are handmade and are the definition of fun," **Smith said.**

<u>OR</u>

From the beginning, Smith wanted to use his newfound skill to bring others joy. (**This is not too repetitive**)

"Ever since I got into woodworking, I wanted to think of a way to make people smile. I love making toys to gift or donate to others because they are handmade and are the definition of fun."
