

Journalistic writing is all about being **CLEAR** and **CONCISE**

- Be aware of repeating times, dates, etc.
- Use descriptive adjectives when they are needed and serve a useful purpose.
- Stronger adjectives usually require fewer words and pack a bigger punch
- Try not to be too wordy: “the, will be, has been, is going, this is, which is, really, very, many, to get to”

### **INCORRECT aka BAD**

“The student body is getting ready for the football game that is coming up Friday evening at 7 p.m. tomorrow.

The SGA will be collecting colorful pink socks at the charity fair tonight at 6:30 p.m. to donate to local hospitals in order to show Breast Cancer awareness.”

Along with physically feeling tired and sick all the time, Smith mentally dealt with serious depression while undergoing chemotherapy because he could not really do much and felt really left out by his friends and alone.

**Less words can/WILL have more impact!**

### **CORRECT**

Students are preparing for tomorrow’s 7 o’clock football game.

“In honor of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, SGA will collect pink socks for local hospitals at the charity fair tonight.”

The physical effects of chemotherapy led to Smith’s mental struggle with depression and loneliness. \*He **felt** like a burden on his parents and **felt** forgotten by his friends.

(\***Parallelism**, or similar sentence structure, helps the flow and impact of the second sentence)

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### **DO NOT EDITORIALIZE**

(do not put yourself or your opinion in the story)

**To easily avoid editorializing: “Blame” the thoughts/feelings/opinions on others**

**According to [Name]**, everyone seemed to have a good time.

**For [Name]**, driving safely is important.

**[Name]** thought/believes/hopes

Disney is the worst place to spend vacation for/to **[Name]** because....

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**In transitions, do NOT state the obvious OR repeat the quote**

After being asked, Smith describes why he loves making toys.

“Ever since I got into woodworking, I wanted to think of a way to make people smile. I love making toys to gift or donate to others because they are handmade and are the definition of fun”, said Smith.

**INSTEAD use pieces of the quote:**

Ever since Smith got into woodworking, he wanted to find a way to make people smile.

“I love making toys to gift or donate to others because they are handmade and are the definition of fun,” **Smith said.**

**OR**

From the beginning, Smith wanted to use his newfound skill to bring others joy.  
**(This is not too repetitive)**

“Ever since I got into woodworking, I wanted to think of a way to make people smile. I love making toys to gift or donate to others because they are handmade and are the definition of fun.”
