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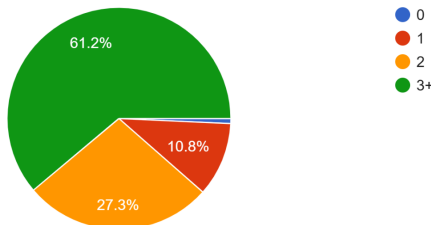

### Making Connections

We live in a time when many people feel disconnected and live without individuals that they know care about them. As a school, we are focusing on supporting students to feel connected to each other and to the adults who are part of our school team.

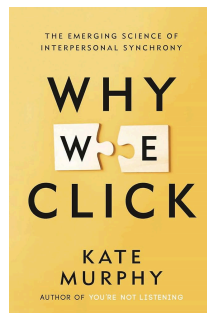
Over the last month, our Grade 2-7 students completed a survey to give our team feedback on ways we can continue to improve our school environment to support them in feeling more connected. One of the questions asked about adult connections. See below for responses.

139 responses



We are encouraged that over 88% have two or more adults that they know care about them. However, we are not satisfied. We continue to look for ways to build relationships between students and with our staff team.

I've recently been reading a book called, *Why We Click*, by Kate Murphy. She explores the science of how humans subconsciously fall into rhythm with one another. Murphy argues that feeling disconnected from those around you can lead to higher stress levels and a weakened immune system.



Some of Murphy's key recommendations include: prioritizing in-person interactions, managing your own rhythm (moods are contagious) and listening with an introspective awareness of our bodies. If this topic interests you, this book may be a worthwhile read.
