Mission	An inclusive Jesuit Catholic college preparatory school, Cheverus teaches students to be people for and with others and to pursue intellectual, spiritual, physical, and personal excellence for the greater glory of God.		
School	Cheverus High School is a private co-educational college preparatory secondary school conducted by the Society of Jesus (Jesuits).		
Accreditation & Memberships	Cheverus High School is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges as a college preparatory high school and has been acknowledged as such since 1963. Cheverus is a member of the Jesuit Schools Network, Association of Independent Schools in New England, New England Association for College Admission Counseling, National Association for College Admission Counseling, and The College Board.		
Faculty	The Cheverus High School faculty consists of 30 instructors. 77% have advanced degrees. There are three administrators, two school counselors, and one campus minister.		
Admission	Admission is based on school performance, teacher reference, community involvement and if needed, a personal interview.		
Students	Total Enrollment, grades 9-12: 343 Senior Class: 81 Cheverus attracts students from 50 communities in southern Maine. In the 2023-2024 school year, Cheverus awarded \$2.88 million in financial aid, assisting 70% of its students.		
Graduation Requirements	25.50 Carnegie Units: English 4 credits, Mathematics 4 credits, Theology 4 credits, World Language 3 credits, Science 3 credits, History 3 credits, Electives 3 credits, Fine & Performing Arts 1 credit, Computer Science ½ credit.		
Community Service Requirement	A hallmark of Jesuit education is to form “men and women for others.” Students in the class of 2024 are required to complete a supervised community service project in May of their senior year, consisting of 120 hours of volunteer work and two 500-word reflection papers.		
Academic Program	All courses are college preparatory. Honors and Advanced Placement courses are offered as listed below. Enrollment in Honors and AP courses is determined by faculty recommendation and GPA. Honors Courses are offered in Choir, Concert Band, Jazz Band, Jazz Combo, Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, English II-III-IV, Biology, Chemistry, History II-III, French 201-301, and Spanish 201-301-401. French 401 and Spanish 401 are only offered at the Honors level. Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered in 17 subjects: Calculus (AB, BC), Computer Science Principles, Statistics, English Language, English Literature, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics, French, Spanish Language, Comparative Government, Economics, United States Government, Psychology, United States History, Music Theory. AP courses are usually only available to juniors and seniors. Theology is an integral part of a Cheverus education. Students undertake a rigorous academic study of Christianity, moral issues, scripture and social justice. These courses draw upon authors and texts including Plato, Aristotle, St. Thomas Aquinas, Albert Camus, Dorothy Day, Papal Encyclicals. College admissions offices are encouraged to include Theology courses when re-calculating GPAs.		

Grading System

All credit courses taken in grades 9-12 are included in the cumulative GPA. Letter grades are awarded for all academic courses. In the calculation of the GPA, Honors and AP courses are weighted by .25 quality points.

Covid Statement: In March 2020, Cheverus transitioned to fully online instruction, synchronously through live video streaming of each class. In September 2020, Cheverus reopened for full time, in-person instruction, with the option to learn remotely. Students learning from home did so synchronously through live video streaming of each class. Since September 2021, Cheverus remains open for full-time in-person instruction with no virtual option.

Curriculum and grading remained consistent and students were expected to meet all outlined course objectives.
