***It is expected that all students attend school on Wednesday, June 17th and Thursday, June 18th. PTHS will be following a regular single-session schedule on both days.** Seniors will be participating in graduation practices while students in Grades 9, 10, and 11 will be reviewing final exams/grades, receiving summer work and preparing for the 2026-2027 school year.

Attendance

It is expected that all students will be present for their final exam/project during their assigned period. **Any student absent from the exam will be required to make it up on the scheduled make-up days on June 17th and 18th.** If a student is absent for multiple days during exam week, he or she must submit a doctor's note to the attendance office seeking approval to make up the exams. Students who attend Morris County Vo-Tech in the morning shared time program will take their exams at designated times based on their schedule.

Senior Exemptions and Physical Education Classes


Seniors who have earned a 93 or above in their full year course may be exempt from taking their final exam as per [Board of Education Policy 5470](#). Any student in Grade 12 who is exempt from their exam does not need to report to school for their scheduled exam period. Students in Grades 9 through 12 do not need to report to school for their Physical Education exam period. Students in Physical Education can report to the cafeteria for a study hall if they so choose.

General Information

Final exams/projects are common assessments by course. Final exams/projects count for 10% of a student's final grade for the course. No other assignments will be assigned during finals week. The goal is for students to focus on these exams/projects and demonstrate their learning to the best of their ability. The cafeteria will be open during exam period times with light snacks being provided.
