The proposed amendment to the NDIS bill, which aims to remove funding for sex toys, sex work, surrogacy, IVF, and menstrual products, directly undermines the empowerment and inclusion of people with disabilities. Sexual health, pleasure, and reproductive rights are fundamental human rights, as affirmed by the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD), which Australia has ratified. Article 25 of the CRPD explicitly recognizes the right of persons with disabilities to attain the highest standard of health without discrimination, including access to sexual and reproductive health services. By stripping away these essential supports, the amendment not only alienates individuals from their rights but also perpetuates the marginalisation and stigma that people with disabilities already face. This move starkly contrasts the principles of equality and non-discrimination embedded in Australian laws, such as the Disability Discrimination Act 1992, which aims to protect the rights of individuals with disabilities and promote their full participation in society. Instead of fostering empowerment, this amendment risks deepening the exclusion of a vulnerable community from the supports necessary to live with dignity and autonomy.
