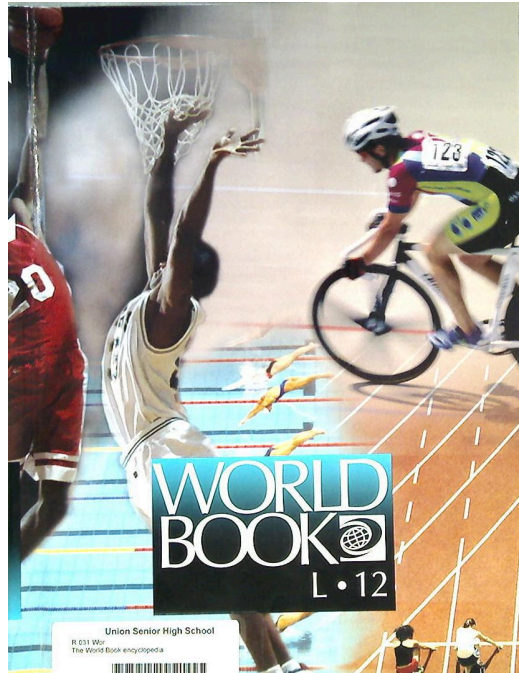
## 6. Encyclopedia

**Lee, Harper** (1926- ), is an American author who became famous with her only novel, *To Kill a Mockingbird* (1960). It won the 1961 Pulitzer Prize for fiction.

The plot centers on Atticus Finch, a small-town lawyer in Alabama who defends a young black man falsely accused of raping a white woman. The story is told by the lawyer's young daughter. The appeal of the novel lies in the author's ability to weave together the vivid eccentric characters of a small town, the observations of a sensitive child, and a plea for social justice.
