




## Where to go for lunch

## Directions to the Library (from Central Station)



By public transport (c. 8-10 min)

#### BLUE

From CENTRAL STATION take METRO 52\* towards STATION ZUID to the next stop called ROKIN\*\*. From ROKIN walk south onto SPUI and turn left from SPUI onto SINGEL after c. 200 m. The library will be on your left after c. 100 m.

- \* Tickets can be bought at a ticket machine at any metro stop.
- \*\* Note the many archaeological finds displayed next to the escalators of ROKIN. These were found during the metro's construction.

#### **GRAY**


From CENTRAL STATION take TRAM 2, 11 or 12 and leave the tram at the KONINGSPLEIN stop. From KONINGSPLEIN head back in the direction the tram came, onto SINGEL. The library will be on your right after c. 100 m.

Tickets can be bought on board the tram.



By foot (c. 18 min)

From Central Station walk south onto DAMRAK past the DAM SQUARE onto ROKIN, and turn right onto SPUI. After c. 200 m. turn left onto SINGEL. The library will be on your left after c. 100 m.
