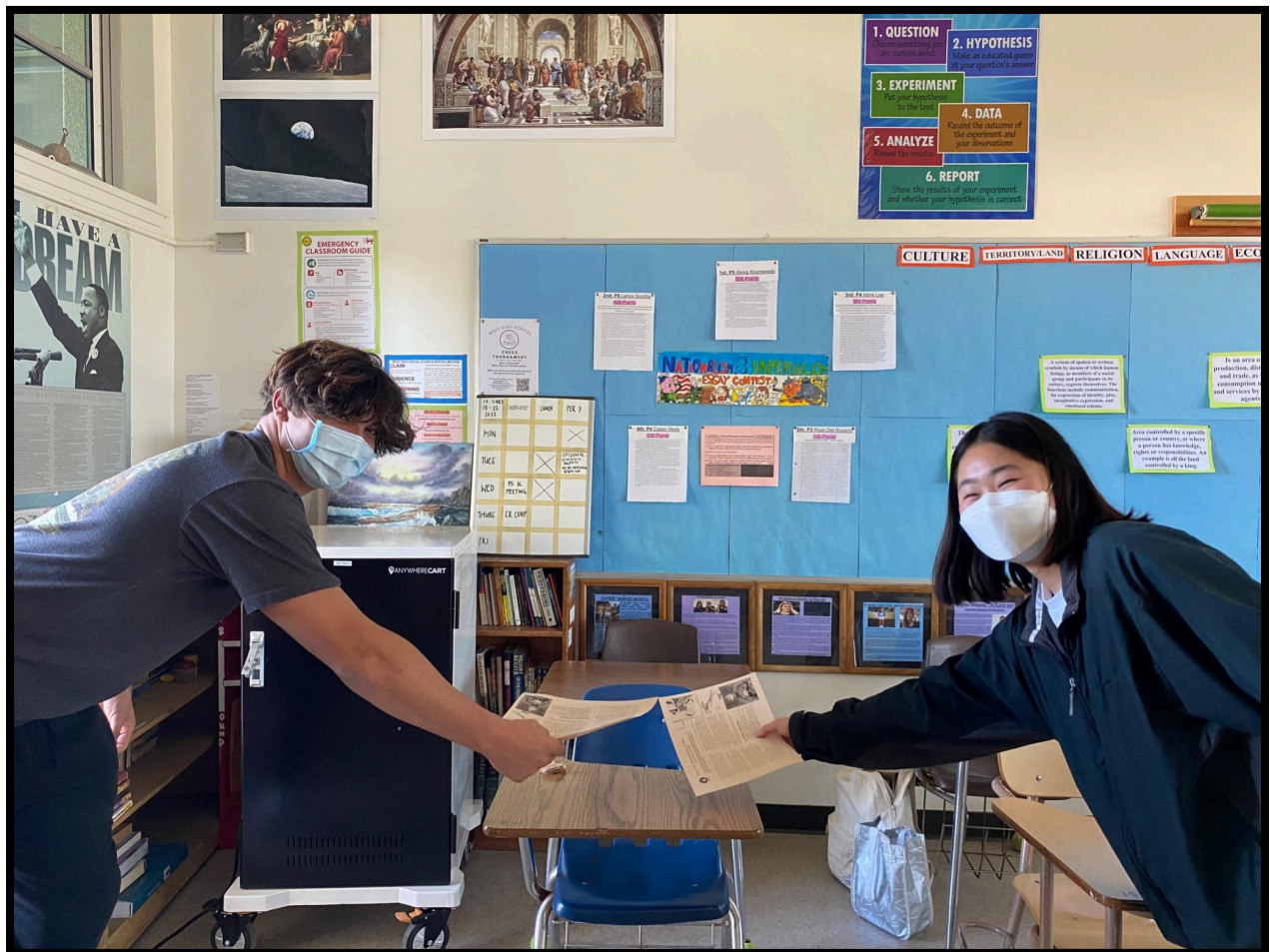
1. How does it feel to finally beat the 12 time unbeaten paper pass out champion?
