

 - o OKR 1 people starting to notice Mozilla stepping in to the AI theme
 - AI Theory of Change
 - Running another survey for KR 3 later this year
 - OKR 2 most donations come in end-of-year, plus major gifts adding momentum
 - OKR 3 good progress on monthly traffic (PNI + grant for web), a little behind on press, but State of Mozilla coming up may help
 - MozFest/House nice breadth of movement/topics in how events were hitting on trustworthy AI topic.
 - OKR 4 execution score target won't know until next survey folks are focused on this across the org
 - Emailing weekly priorities to aid in transparency on what's moving this week + weekly exec team minutes
 - D&I new committee formed, chaired by Michael & Sara, plus Chad Amy, Tais & Kalpana
 - Things moving on planning/budgeting directors + Janice & Solana and exec team meeting in Toronto next week to flesh out and prioritize org-wide objectives for 2020

- State of the Internet Katharina Borchert (5 mins)
 - General Intro
 - Building on trustworthy AI but also much bigger
 - Creating a vision for bigger, bolder mozilla that will impact our mission for next 5-10 years
 - Goal is to drive explorations that we can test in market (product & tech MoCo) and that address critical topics in online life
 - IHR was a main driver to identify possible opportunities
 - Surveillance economy is first focus area broad and enables us to think of a range of related issues
 - IDEO working to help design a repeatable process "innovation rotation"
 - Over 60 interviews so far, deep dive in SF next week to distill learnings
 - Presenting an update at All Hands

- **Privacy Not Included -** Jen Caltrider (5 mins)
 - See the Guide!
 - **Talking points & ways to reach out to share the guide
 - o And the IHR companion piece, Privacy Included
 - Biggest trend companies are getting better on security, many more products meeting our minimum security guidelines, still not doing great on privacy (as they're gathering more and more data)
 - PetChatz' privacy policy only included their website, not their products, but they changed it, asked us to update the buyer's guide - they're paying attention!
 - Companies are getting better about privacy policies written for consumers
 - Creepy: Fitness trackers for kids 6 and up (too young!) Connected litter box (why?)
 - Not so creepy: \$\$ items
 - Shout-out to comms team for great global coverage!

• Gender Diversity + AI - Kostas Stathoulopoulos (7 mins)

- I think we need better ways to measure the technical progress, economic and societal impact of Artificial Intelligence. To study AI progress and quantify its **trustworthiness**, these estimates need to be reliable and granular enough so that we can examine AI activity (inputs, outputs and externalities) for a particular time period, location and subfield. I consider my work on <u>Gender Diversity in AI Research</u> part of this effort. Some bits of this work will also be featured in the <u>AI Index</u> report that's coming out at the end of the year. Here are some other reports/papers I've written on AI measurement:
 - Tracking AI progress and its directionality: That's the first piece of a 5-part report. The second one (to be published on the 21st of November) is on Gender Diversity.
 - Deep learning, deep change? Mapping the development of the Artificial Intelligence General Purpose Technology

- Identifying trends, geography and content of gender diversity in AI research
 - Measuring inferred gender
- Results- only 14% of AI authors are women, proportion of females working in other topics has increased. Canada, UK, Spain on the rise re: women AI researchers. Papers with female co-authors tend to be more focused on health, social issues & computer vision (less on robotics, deep learning, etc)
