NOTE – HIST 1013, HIST 1023, and ENG 1013 transfers as elective hours. However, all will substitute for their corresponding course when students complete the associates degree as part of this articulation agreement.

NOTE – Both EDU 2013 and 2803 must be completed in order for the student to be awarded credit for EDFD 2020. If both courses are not completed, each course will only transfer for general elective hours and the student will be required to complete EDFD 2020 at Harding.

NOTE – Students who have completed an Associates’ Degree with the required coursework can enroll in the 2+2 program at Harding. Students who have not completed an Associates’ Degree must complete all required coursework and a minimum of 60 hours of college credit to enroll.
