Compilations

Compilation albums that are on well known labels, or compilation albums that have a variety of well known artists are going to be put on the guide, whether the label be moderately obscure or very well known. Genre won't necessarily qualify for this portion of the guide, as compilations usually feature artists that produce exponentially different subgenres.

Requirements

In order for an album to qualify for recognition by Joki, it has to have a successful release & it has to be well received overall, by the community. Regarding genre classification, if its considered a good example for any of the above listed subgenres, then it also is added to the guide, due to its representation of whatever subgenre the release is trying to be. Length of the release for any of the featured subgenres does not matter, but if it is a single (often rare) then it'll be considered before adding, due to problems with length. Another factor of which is important is the overall feeling that the album gives, whether it be unsettling, dreamy, or even comedic (when parody is put into consideration.) Regarding the amount of time a label has existed for, it only

Originality is also a very important factor, as releases on Joki under any subgenre should either stay true to the overall theme of the subgenre, or it should successfully bring forth new concepts and ideas to the subgenre, propelling it forth into several directions, and maybe even creating new ones in the process.

The Community's Addition
