About Workshop	<p>The workshop is organized as part of the Inter Pares Partnership with the Federal Parliament of Nepal, on 23-25 May 2025, in Kathmandu. It invites Members and staff from the Parliament of Nepal, representatives of EU Member States Parliaments as well as leading local and international expert scholars to discuss parliaments' role in lawmaking, which is one of the priority themes of the partnership.</p> <p>The Nepal's Constitution and legislation framework provide a robust foundation for effective functioning of Parliament's legislative responsibilities. Parliamentarians have the right of legislative initiative. There are opportunities to debate and amend bills during plenary sessions. Although parliamentary committees do not initiate legislation, they can amend bills. At the oversight stage, committees call ministers and civil servants to provide evidence on the implementation of legislation. The Parliament has operational committee secretariats and the research service has the technical knowledge to support legislative research and drafting.</p> <p>The Parliament of Nepal has identified opportunities for enhancing the practical implementation of parliament's legislative role. Areas include strengthening the capacities of MPs and staff to draft, scrutinize and amend laws, reinforce the knowledge and capacities of committee secretariats and research services to provide effective policy and legislative analysis to MPs, effectively engaging in the delegated legislation process, and strengthen oversight mechanisms to ensure effective implementation of laws and policies.</p> <p>In this context, the workshop aims to strengthen the parliamentary capacity for effective legislative scrutiny and oversight through mutual learning and exchange of experiences, challenges and successful practices between the Federal Parliament of Nepal and the EU Member States Parliaments. The specific objectives of the workshop are to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Provide an overview of the legislative cycle with the focus on parliaments' legislative powers and the role of parliamentary committees. - Exchange knowledge and experiences about key principles in legal drafting process and how to scrutinize laws to ensure they serve the purpose, align with the established constitutional and legal framework, are relevant, effective and are adopted through the consultative and inclusive processes.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Demonstrate different approaches and methodologies used by parliaments to oversee the implementation of legislation and evaluate the impact of laws and policies. - Showcase different parliamentary practices in addressing delegated legislation and support the Parliament of Nepal with developing a set of procedures on tracking and overseeing the implementation of delegated legislation. - Through the practical exercises support the committee secretariats and research services of the Nepali Parliament to enhance their support to MPs.
