"On completion of this unit the student should understand the presentation, conservation and care of artworks, including the conservation and care of their own artworks."

In preparing for this outcome, we will:

• visit at least two galleries, museums, collections, online galleries, other exhibition spaces and / or site-specific exhibitions to visit during the year of study.

You will:

• select 1 artwork (different exhibition from U3O3) to discuss; it would be ideal to choose an artwork that relates to the art forms you are working on in your own artworks for your SAT.

Note:

We will be presenting our SAC as an embedded document in your Website (the same website that you presented your Unit 303 SAC on.)

Criterion 7

Part 1: Analysing how artworks are conserved and cared for:

*Your teacher will "Share" a Google Slide document with you for you to work on for Part 1.

We will at least two exhibitions and / or art collections behind the scenes and examine the methods used and considerations involved in the presentation, conservation and care of specific artworks and art forms.

When visiting each exhibition / collection we will aim to develop an understanding of practices used to present and care for artworks in specific contexts to ensure that there are no unintended physical changes or damage to artworks while they are on display. We will engage with specific examples of conservation practices for different art forms and learn about considerations for safeguarding artworks now and for the future.

We will study and develop an understanding of best practice / museum standards in relation to the presentation and conservation of specific artworks and art forms including:

- Exhibition furniture, including plinths and vitrines ("A large, glass cabinet used for displaying art objects".
 Source: TATE|Vitrine)
- <u>Invigilation</u> (ie security personnel, or plain clothed "gentle organisers")
- Art handling, transport and storage
- Condition reporting
- Principles of material stability in different art forms (including conceptual works, digital works, performance works, works produced using unstable materials and / or obsolete technologies)
- Lighting levels while artworks are on display and in storage
- How temperature and humidity can affect the condition of artworks on display and in storage
- Ethical and cultural considerations and protocols for the display, storage and handling of specific artworks, including works by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists
- Balancing the intentions of artists with the conservation of artworks and access for audiences.

4. Application to your own artwork

- How do you want your artwork to be displayed?
- Do you want the audience to engage with your artwork?

- How can you manage people within your exhibition space to minimize risk?
- What is your main concern in conserving your artwork?
- What are the key concerns for your material?
- Is your material sturdy or sensitive? Why? How would this impact the conservation strategy?
- Look at the visual glossary and select 3 kinds of possible damage or deterioration that might affect your chosen artwork.
- How they could affect your work and what could be done to mitigate the risk?

Have a think about the various considerations such as:

<u>Eg. Lighting</u>

- What are the lighting requirements of your artwork?
- What strategies could you use to minimize the negative impact of light?
- What are some limitations of your exhibition space compared to a gallery when it comes to lighting?
- Compare: How are your strategies similar or different to the artwork you chose from the exhibition in the gallery? Criterion 3, Criterion 4
