 2. Senator Dyer: USGWV PB
 - a) The Participatory Budgeting Initiative is a democratic process designed to involve students directly in generating ideas, developing proposals, building consensus, and implementing impactful projects on campus. This initiative allocates a budget of roughly \$3,000 to \$5000 to fund three student-led proposals once at full capacity, each aimed at addressing the needs and priorities of the West Valley campus.
 - b) The presentation will cover the structure of the PB process, including the recruitment of student participants, the organization of student assemblies, and the development and approval of proposals. Additionally, I will emphasize the initiative's broader goals of fostering a culture of engagement, improving the quality of student participation, and empowering students to take an active role in shaping their campus environment.
 - c) I will also outline strategies for overcoming potential challenges, such as recruiting and sustaining student involvement and ensuring the feasibility of projects within university policies. By sharing examples from other universities, like Palo Alto College and CUNY, we can explore how PB has successfully impacted other communities and how we can adapt these lessons for our campus.
 - d) This initiative represents an opportunity to cultivate leadership, enhance student participation, and leave a lasting impact on our university
 - e) Senator Dyer: I yield time to Director of sustainability cole



- f) Director Cole: Is this for existing or new initiatives?

VI. Old Business

A. (SB03) Senate Bill 3 - USGWV Budget Ammendment

1. Discussion

- a) Senator Hayes: I yield my time to President Shahin
- b) President Shahin: This bill is to amend the USG-WV budget. MCOE, Common read, and crisis fund were moved under transfer outs under the office of the President. PAB increase was what PAB presented at the last senate meeting. Nothing is set in stone yet. I would like to hear from you all.
- c) Senator Hayes: I don't think we should automatically increase it to \$20,000. We should increase it to \$10,000 and maybe increase it if they need it.
- d) Senator President Pritchard: This requesting of funds should not be a new normal. I do not think it is wise to leave that door open.
- e) Senator Guereque: If it is done that way it would be harder for PAB to allocate what they want to spend and how they will spend it.
- f) Senator Perry: Doing it in one lump will also not waste our time, and PAB made a very convincing argument and while they were given a set budget in the beginning of the year, it would be generous of us to allot them the \$20,000. Thai should be made clear it's a one time thing.
- g) Senator Briones: Their argument was very convincing. And as we know there are changes that happen throughout the year.
- h) Senator hayes: I yield my time to director Reich



- i) Director Reich: We have more in appropriations than last year. This issue does not seem to be a one time thing though. I believe we should give them funding but not a full \$20,000.
- j) Senator Briones: I agree with Director Reich.
- k) Senator Newton: I was absent the last senate meeting when this was discussed. Is this supposed to be used immediately or throughout the semester?
- l) Senate President Hayes: This comes out of appropriation and goes to their exec fund.
- m) Senator Hayes: What I want is the stipulations in the bill.
- n) Senate President Pritchard: Point of clarification, are we allowed to make stipulations to a new bill or would it have to be a new bill?
- o) Senator Hayes: I motion to yield time to President Shahin
- p) President Shahin: I do not know if we can add other stipulations
- q) Senate President Prithcad: In my personal opinion it would be better to draft a new bill regarding the feedback.
- r) Senator Hayes: I agree.
- s) President Shahin: Can we open discussion for stipulations you would want to see? Along with the amount, and vote on the bill.
- t) Senator Dyer: I have a comment. I think we should just put trust in the organization that is requesting this money. If we prolong this, that organization will not be able to serve the students.
- u) Senate President Pritchard: USG has its own budget and it is not touched by us. We are not saying they will misuse it.
- v) Senator Perry: I would like to stipulate that it can not be used for team bonding unless there is enog funds where that is plausible.
- w) President Shahin: I was planning on including that that money is not to be used for team bonding and any left over funds will be sent back to USG. Director Reich and I will be checking in with them to see if they are spending it properly.
- x) Senator Briones: Didn't we have \$30,000 left over in appropriations last year?
- y) Senate President Prichard: Yes, bit that was due to caution on the senators side.
- z) Senator Guereque: Is the stipulation that it can not be used for team bonding a part of the bill already?

- aa) President Shahin: No but it will be in the funding letter.
- bb) Senator Guereque: I find it a little indifferent that they can not golf any bondings next semester.
- cc) President shahin: The \$20,000 can not be used towards team bonding

- ee) VPS Noriega Pineda: I am concerned with how the finding was handled in the beginning of the year. How, with us allotting that money, would this affect how much we contribute to their events?

- gg) VPS Noriega Pineda: After denying they said they would reach out for tabling but they never did. It felt as though since we did not give them the money they never reached out.
- hh) Senator Guereque: We are talking about this from more of a director standpoint. I do see where you are coming from.
- ii) Senate President Pritchard: Thank you Senator Guereque for trying to answer the PAB questions.
- jj) Senator Newton: I yield time to director Recih
- kk) Director Riech: USG had leftover money in our account and so did PAB. However, thai should not play a factor either way. I think that we also need to look at past events and future proofing. We should consider possibly giving them less money. I would hate for them to come back
- ll) Senator Newton: I do think we should give them some funds, but I want to make sure that this will sustain them for the semester.
- mm) Senate President Pritchard: It sounds like they were in some positions where they had to give money to other university wide events. I see why they are requesting this.
- nn) Senator Newton: Is there a reason they are requesting this money?
- oo) Snake president pritchard: From what I understand they have been putting on more events due to more students being here and less clubs putting on events.
- pp) Senator Briones: I yield time to President Shahin.
- qq) President Shahin: They have been asked to program more frequently. I know there is a concern that the money is coming out

of appropriations. It has been discussed that this is just a one time thing. We can draft a resolution and present it whenever our next senate is. The reason we are in the situation is that we combined two line items from last year's president, and in combining them there was miscommunication about what USG would be funding. They found out they would have to cover those events separately and they have been asked to cover a lot.

- rr) Senator Newton: Are there any ways we can help them fulfill these duties? I yield my time to President Shahin.
- ss) President Shahin: No. The budgeting we have made for programming would not make this possible. This would also be a strain onto the USG members that is needed. I would rather leave this programming to PAB.
- tt) Senator Senator Briones: I completely understand what director Reih is saying. Last year there was a lot of club involvement but this year there is minimal involvement. What does PAB have a say in what events they fund?
- uu) Senator Guereque: We did have rollover money but it was already used to fund inferno fest. Right now they need money for the exec team and Devilpalooza. A lot of sponsors pulled out for inferno fest which is why they had to pay more than other years. I would not want them to come back and ask for another \$20,000 next year.
- vv) Senate president Pritchard: Please keep in mind that the bill presented today s what you will be voting on.

- xx) President Shahin: Our rollover money goes to one time funding. There is a big process that goes into approving one time funding requests.

1. Health Fair:

- a) We had 151 students checked in

2. Health Advisory Committee

- a) HPV Vaccination Effort



- (1) On Monday, Tempe had a successful campus vaccination event that vaccinated 85 students. A follow-up is planned to reach out to students who missed their appointments. This effort also involved education and outreach by faculty, students, and the health center, supported by recruitment, marketing, and health education.
- b) Substance Misuse Awareness Event
 - (1) There was an event focused on substance abuse prevention, particularly concerning opioid and fentanyl risks. The event involved collaboration between the university and community agencies. It emphasized student-led initiatives with support from faculty and staff, demonstrating the community's role in addressing student health issues.
- c) Health Center Services
 - (1) The health center is raising awareness of its services, including sports medicine, women's health, and transgender care. There is a focus on promoting awareness among students about these services, especially during emergencies. The center is open to feedback from the committee on improving services or website usability.
- d) Addiction Services
 - (1) The health center does not provide comprehensive addiction treatment but supports students in early recovery with counseling and community connections. The goal is to support students in recovery, and the center works with external community resources for more intensive care.
- e) International Students
 - (1) The committee discussed the challenges faced by international students in accessing healthcare due to differences in expectations and healthcare systems. There are efforts to improve education and support for international students in healthcare matters, including a discussion about language barriers and making the healthcare process more accessible.
- f) Insurance Update



(1) The renewal documents from the insurance vendor are expected in January, but there may be changes in healthcare policies due to political shifts. The committee is advised to inform students about potential impacts on healthcare and insurance coverage, with the assurance that the university will support students during transitions.

(1) The committee considered student-led efforts to advocate for more flexibility in academic policies, particularly around mental health and assignment deadlines. This could lead to culture change and more support for students facing mental health challenges.

1. **PAB Budget Proposal - Senate Defense**
2. Representative: If we did not receive an increase a lot of our events would not be possible.
3. Senator Hernandez Duran: What is SSSG?
4. Representative: That is Sparky's Spring Survival Games.
5. Director Lugo Ortecho: Are the events coming out of both departments?
6. Representative: It depends.



7. Representative: In our event tables we included our collaboration events as well.
8. Director Peart: It was mentioned that this was all from door knocking but this only states it is for one event.
9. Representative: That was just an example that was used.
10. Senate President Prichard: will you be using the proposed budget for these events?
11. Representative: The budget would go to the exec team. If we do not get the increase, we will need to pull from our individual committee budgets. This request is mainly for collabs, emergency funds, and Devilpalooza. We are only asking for 20K
12. Senator Perry: How much are you expecting to provide for Devilpalooza?
13. Representative: We are being asked to provide 20K. This budget is to make sure we do not go into debt.
14. Director Espinoza: Is the 20K being asked of all campuses?
15. Representative: Yes. Downtown, Poly and West are being asked for 20K. Tempe is for 40K
16. Vice President of Services Noriega Pineda: Is there a reason that the amount you are being asked to pay is not matching the budget?
17. Representative: We may be the smallest campus however, Downtown and Poly do not have that big of an increase of students from West. We have a slightly larger budget.
18. Vice President of Services Noriega Pineda: Where is this money being budgeted from?
19. Representative: From our exec budget. A majority has been used for InfernoFest.
20. Director Lugo Ortecho: Do you know how much money you have used this semester this far?
21. Representative: No. We do not have those numbers right now.
22. Vice President of Services Noriega Pineda: Where would this increase go?
23. Representative: To all of PAB.
24. Senate President Prichard: Is there a way this money can go directly to the students?
25. Representative: We have canceled many team bondings and prioritize student events. We would make sure everything that needs to be paid for is paid for and to have the budget allocated to other departments.



26. President Shahin: We can stipulate that the money does not go to the exec department. If there is any money left we can also stipulate that is left goes back to USG. There are a lot of stipulations that could be added.
27. Senator Hernandez Duran: If you don't receive the money would you have to give 10K?
28. Representative: It may be closer to 5K. We would be pulling from each of our departments.
29. Director Lugo Ortecho: How big of a pushback would it be if the senators waited until your budget information was given back?
30. Representative: We can wait until December 6th but we would prefer to know sooner than later.
31. Senate President Pritchard: We will not be voting on the budget today.
32. Director Reich: The information from EJ will provide us some insight but the budget may not be out by the 1st of the month. Do you have any say in how much is spent for university wide events?
33. Representative: We do not have a say in how much we pitch in. This is decided by the Devilpalooza committee.
34. President Shahin: The report of what is spent in the previous month is usually sent at the beginning of the month.
35. VPS: Someone decides how much you will pay in the spring before the semester?
36. Representative: Yes. We do not usually find out how much until fall semester.
37. VPS: Is there a reason these agreements are not being held?
38. Representative: It is not in our hands. We do not really have a choice.
39. VPS: When did you start noticing the decrease in funds?
40. Representative: In the beginning of the semester, but we were told to wait to ask for more.
41. VPS: If there was a lack of funds from the beginning, why allow for more events to happen than is required?
42. Representative: That was not our choice, but it did fall on PAB to host them. We are also doing more events due to the lack of other club events.
43. President Shahin: PAB used to be a part of ASASU. We decided to make them their own organization. We still have a very high amount of appropriations as clubs are not holding events.




44. Representative: We have an increase in our events and attendance this year.
45. Director Lugo Ortecho: Has there been communication about how you can not afford to pay more?
46. Representative: They do know every single breakdown of all of this. We still do have to pay a significant amount to be fair to each campus. We do not want to cut back on events locally.
47. Senator Hernandez Duran: We would cover all of Devilpalooza. Would it make sense then if we just give 13K, then you cover the 5K, and we give you 2K extra for emergencies? So we would give you 15K?
48. Representative: That would get rid of 3 events. We have no more budget. It is all gone.
49. Senator Guereque: We are kind of clarifying what their plans are. They are not asking for the budget to be used for bondings, maybe just 2K.
50. Senator Briones: I know 20K is the minimum you want to request, but what is the maximum?
51. Representative: Realistically, 25K.
52. Director Reich: Will the senators get to discuss?
53. Senate President Pritchard: Yes. We will not be voting today.
54. Director Lugo Ortecho: For senators is there a way to make it to where the emergency fund can not be used unless there are certain conditions?
55. Representative: The emergency fund did go to an emergency.
56. Director Lugo Ortecho: Should the emergency fund be only used for emergencies and not events?
57. Representative: Ours is mostly just fees.
58. President Shahin: I want to stay away from the idea of the emergency fund. I want to thank PAB for coming and all of you for asking these important questions.
59. Discussion
 - a) Senator Briones: I feel like they do deserve the 20K.
 - b) Senate president Pritchard: Our appropriation is directly for the students. I brought up their team bonding. It is important, I get it. However, if we were to deny a club funds to give PAB funds for team bonding it would not be right. We would need to make sure that the funds should go to the students.



- c) Senator Guereque: It is only a small percentage of the money they are asking for bonding. We do not want to exclude them from bondings.
- d) Director Reich: Yes we do have money left, but that does not indicate whether or not we should give this money to PAB.
- e) Senate President: Do you know what percentage we would be at?
- f) Director Reich: We would be at 40%.
- g) Director Kinney: A lot of clubs biggest events happen in the second semester.
- h) Director Cole: PAB sets the bar with a lot of their events, and spends most of their money next semester on their events.
- i) Director Espinoza: When they mentioned moving money around, we as directors do get a set budget. That is set in stone.
- j) Senator Perry: I do not feel comfortable allowing PAB to take money for students if it is to be used for team bonding. These funds we can't even touch for ourselves to use for team bonding. I am seeing that they had 39K from last year go into their budget. I believe this could have been allocated better, and limiting the amount of events. However if you are having issues with the budget, you need to go back to what you are required to do and just that.
- k) President Shahin: I feel we need to wrap up this discussion now. I believe that the 39K was used for devilpalooza.
- l) Senate President Pritchard: They have the proposal for 20K. You were saying that there was a certain amount that could be moved around for them. What is that number range?
- m) President Shahin: Around 15K-18K.
- n) Senate President Pritchard: They are asking for 20K.
- o) President Shahin: I would recommend we do 15-18K. I would like to take a temperature vote on it.
- p) President Shahin: I will be stipulating all the stipulations in my letter to them. Whatever concerns you have about their budget you can go to me about.
- q) Senate president pritchard: We will move to a temperature vote. No money? That's 0. 15K? That's 3. 18K? That's 2. 20? That's 4.
