<b>Unit 2 Title:</b> Winter Concert	<b>Start Date:</b> Mid-October	<b>End Date:</b> Mid-December
<p><b>Unit Summary:</b> Students will prepare and present their first formal concert of the school year. Rhythm, pitch, and tone are major focal points for this unit, although other areas are also incorporated. Students will continue their work with self-reflection, widening their focus to include their section and the ensemble.</p>
