CRIMES / INCIDENTS

Crimes recorded between 01/08/2025 and 31/08/2025.

North Queensferry – There were 15 crimes recorded during this period. One crime relates to threatening or abusive behaviour, whilst the other offences relate to the FRB or traffic offences.

Inverkeithing – There were 51 crimes recorded during this period. This includes crimes of violence, threatening and abusive behaviour, assaults against police and road traffic offences.

Dalgety Bay/Hillend – There were 25 crimes recorded during this period. Most crimes were for theft by shoplifting however, other crimes reported include Police assault and traffic offences.

Aberdour – There was 1 crime recorded within Aberdour during the month of August.

CALLS TO POLICE

78 calls relate to North Queensferry. The vast majority relate to the motorway network or FRB.

208 calls relate to the Inverkeithing area.


