INSULATION

INSTALL WATERPROOF BARRIERS

Especially in your eaves, vents, chimneys, dormers, skylights, and other prone areas. These barriers will work wonders when helping prevent leaks from rainwater and melting ice.

PRE-MANUFACTURED FLASHING

Putting these all along roof openings helps a lot. Roof flashings are designed to direct the flow of water away from the vulnerabilities of your roof. During rains and storms

these help keep a flow of water from getting backed up resulting in heavyweight and pressure on your roof. If these areas build up they could cause plenty of damage.

ROOF DECK PROTECTION

Install underlayment to shingles lay flat, otherwise, water will get underneath them. The last thing you want is for water to collect under your shingles. This not only damages individual shingles at an alarming rate, but they also compromise the integrity of your entire roof.

HIP AND RIDGE CAP SHINGLES

These are designed to protect your roof from wind damage and they look nice. A great upgrade for sure. The wind is an underestimated cause of roof damage. The amount of force that wind can exert upon parts of your roof can definitely cause major damage.
